# **Holy Water!**

The current heatwave presents a challenge for all of us. Some parts of Scotland and Ireland already face the threat of drought. Here in the East we are more fortunate. The water companies tell us that our reservoirs are still 90% full. Nonetheless, it is only sensible for each us to use water sensibly. For example, when we run water and wait for it to become hot, we can avoid wasting the run off – such as by using a bucket to collect it and use it on the garden. This may seem a simple and ordinary thing to do – but do you realise that it could also be a holy thing to do?!

In 'Rejoice and Be Glad' (Gaudate et Exsultate) Pope Francis says about holiness: -

"This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures."

What does the Holy Father mean by this? There are, of course, many ways in which we can use a few minutes to express our faith – through brief morning prayers, saying the rosary, blessing the food we eat and so on, But the pope is talking about more than religious observances.

"We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves."

So how do we do this? It is through doing what we do each day at home and at work with Christ in mind and love of Him and our neighbour in our hearts – like being careful to conserve water, since this not only helps us, but our neighbours too and (if we garden) even a small part of God's creation.

In the same way, our day-to-day contact with people, especially with strangers, provide opportunities sometimes for kindness or just patient forbearance, that imitate Christ's readiness to reach out to everyone. Such 'small gestures' of kindness, generosity, friendship, self-restraint or humility demonstrate clearly a willingness to love our neighbours and to follow Christ on our journey to holiness.

We left Kirtling at 10 o'clock. We had 9 adults, five children and a dog starting the walk. Fr Simon joined us about a mile in. We carried our own version of the Lampedusa Cross made from driftwood and stopped to share the stories from the CAFOD resources. 3 of our older parishioners who felt they weren't able to walk the full distance walked the last mile (ish!) of the journey. One member of our group who was away in Ireland walked 6 miles in the Burren at the same time we were walking. We finished in Newmarket and celebrated Mass with other parishioners.

We added 83 miles to the total and already the UK-wide pilgrimage has almost completed two laps around the world!
