"Change and decay in all around I see" (Abide with Me)

What is it about us that we complain so frequently (and loudly) when things change?

New £5 and £10 pound notes come in and we complain that they are plastic, cannot be straightened once folded, fly out when our purses/wallets are opened! We complain when it's wet, then moan when (as now) the sun shines day after day (it's called summer!).

Things were much better when we were young, say the elderly. Things must get better, say the young. Nostalgia (probably for a past that never existed) and wishful thinking (for an impossible future) join hands in conjuring a fog that dampens our spirits and exiles any joy in living in exchange for cosy grumbledom. Pope Francis has something to say about this:

"The saints surprise us, they confound us, because by their lives they urge us to abandon a dull and dreary mediocrity."

Gaudate et Exsultate – Rejoice and be Glad 2017

This is part of the pope's campaign to teach us about holiness and how we can achieve it:

"We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves."

So, moaning and complaining is not the path to holiness! Instead, in each change we can see an opportunity to progress spiritually. And we don't have to do this alone. First and foremost, Christ is always with us offering to help us, especially when change is uncomfortable, unwelcome or apparently unnecessary or nonsensical.

Secondly, as Francis points out, we achieve holiness through community – the community of the family, the neighbourhood and the parish. Remember too that *Abide with Me* is about the joy of salvation, not the challenges of living!

We are on the brink of changes that will affect us as a parish for years to come. We do not yet know who our new parish priest will be, though we pray that there *will* be a new priest to lead us. Whoever it is, some of us will like him immediately – with others it will take time. That's natural and normal. For all of us it will be an opportunity of the sort Pope Francis wishes on us – an opportunity to welcome our new shepherd with warmth, whatever we feel about the change and to learn about him, about our community and about our own capacity to put personal feelings and opinions to one side in order to find the love we owe to Christ, to one another and to each shepherd sent to us.
