MARCH MEETING NOTES

The red line on the pistol range floor will soon be painted yellow to match the rifle range. Expect parts of the pistol range to be closed off while the paint dries.

The club is looking for a new shotgun chairman. The chairman will be required to have the shotgun range open at 10am on the third Sunday of each month, operate the automated trap thrower, and assist members with their shotgun techniques. We will no longer have the shotgun range open on the first Wednesday evening of the month due to a lack of participation. The Bullseve targets allowed 7 shots, counting the highest 5 scores.

Tim Klima served as match director and designed a challenging course with a longrange relay: Seventy-five vards (a ways out there for round-ball rifles) at the 6-inch doublebull Buffalo target, 50 yards at the 4-inch Bullseye target and 25 yards offhand at the Woodchuck target, for a total of 20 scoring shots and 200 points possible. Bill Sick and Eric Burkhead provided precision scoring services.

We had the necessary repairs done on the 300-yard line irrigation system that we reported on last month. A new valve was installed and a bit of supply pipe consolidation was completed. An air leak in the piston assembly that controls the turning pistol range targets used for bullseye shooting is starting to cause problems. We are looking into replacing the unit.

The month of March witnessed continuing development of the Paul Bunyan Black Powder Pistol Trail Walk and Clubhouse (nicknamed the 'Dismal Nitch' in honor of Lewis & Clark). A dozen Paul Bunyan members have contributed time and materials to get this new discipline to 98% of completion and now ready for use by all members of our Paul Bunyan Club. This project has been a productive 12 months in the making!



The former shotgun range storage shed has been refurbished into a warm and welcoming Clubhouse for Pistol Trail and Shotgun shooters to enjoy relaxation and companionship out of our NW winter weather. Several firewood sheds have been constructed and filled for the woodstove. The final step will be to pressure wash and paint the exterior of the building, weather permitting.



The Trail through our sylvan woodlot has been cleared, smoothed and covered with woodchips for ease of walking. March has seen the addition of numerous benches along the path for resting and loading. A total of 20 creative metal targets are hung along the Trail for the full shooting experience.
