Generative and Strategic Work

- · Linda submitted a report via email regarding caregivers, senior gatherings, and continued work with Teeny Tears.
- Cynthia moved and Brad seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. The motion carried.
- Joanne and Ed obtained an air conditioner for the pastor's office which will be

installed shortly. Donations will be accepted to cover the cost.

- One bid has been obtained for AC units for Fellowship Hall with a second underway. When the bids are in, Colleen and Mike will make a recommendation, and a vote will be made via email.
- The bid for repair work due to the steam pipe leak in Fellowship. Hall is for \$22,750. Following installation of the AC units, we will know what funds can enhance the \$12,000 still available for the project.
- Ed and Mike will address the steam pipe leak in the pastor's office within the next few weeks.
- United Women in Faith have the funds and would like to replace the ice machine in the kitchen. Mike will obtain the specifications from Darren and the purchase will be made.
- Additional keys for the church are needed. Mike will have a conversation with Darren.
- A team recruitment will be held in September. Brad and Joanne will collaborate with Amanda to establish a vision for the event so they can then share information with team leads.
- Several requests have been made for the installation of a handrail at the bottom of the stairs.
- Mike suggested we wait until September to embark on a financial campaign as soon as possible. Amanda will craft a letter so we can prepare a mailing. Amanda, Donna, and Samantha will update the mailing list.
- There was discussion regarding having a fundraiser that will bring in additional monies while bringing fun and fellowship to the church body. Members of the board will brainstorm names of several people who might be willing to be involved.
- Name tags will be utilized as previously discussed. Both members and guests will be offered clip-on name tags. Amanda will ask Samantha to coordinate additional greeters.
- Walking leaders are still needed to support VBS. Pastor Amanda also needs a 'sidekick;' board members will share names of candidates with the pastor.
- The board is happy to announce that Keith Sandrock has accepted the position of organist and will begin his duties on August 6th.

Most Current Financial Update (Note: this is posted after the Minutes of the previous month have been approved)

The 2023 budget is \$175,503.49 (with the average monthly contribution amount needed of \$14,625, 8.3%, needed each month to meet the budget). The contributions for June came to \$9533.74 in donations, making the year to date \$74,596.85. That is 43% of the needed 49.8% at this time.





Roger Boyd, church member and president of the Santa Trail Historical Society, is spearheading the application effort to put Baldwin First on the Kansas Historical Society. The first step, in an estimated 12 -18 month application process. That step is submitting a Preliminary Site Information Question for the state to evaluate the church's eligibility to be listed on the Registry for Historic Kansas Places. Some of the benefits of this listing includes the honorific recognition for historic significance (as we know it for **God and his Glory in our community**); qualifying the owner for state tax credit eligibility for property rehabilitation and maintenance work; and it helps educate the public and community about Baldwin City's historic and culture resources.
