705 pm: Opening Prayer was given by Doug Cheek

Doug Cheek presented the Orientation of typical meeting, expectations, and gave the spiritual formation devotion focusing on the work that has been done for the church over the last year and speaking on our sister Laura and all she did for the congregation and community. She will always be a part of our lives and a part of this congregation.

Mike Curran presented a story on how we lead in the community. He shared that a gentlemen and his son came into the church after most of the congregation had left on a Sunday and was looking for blessed water for his son who had experienced and bad dream the night before. It just so happened that on that Sunday the sermon was on Jesus baptism and we did in fact have blessed water (not something we normally have). Just a small anecdote to day that our church is a pillar of the community and we all serve as leaders.

There was a review of new people that have attended in the past month. Future meetings will expand on this subject.

In Future meetings there will be a Goal Review and Accountability Conversation as our Church Goals are established for the year.

Doug indicated that a Packet and Consent Calendar will be sent along with last months minutes a week before the Leadership Board Meeting.

Team Leads were discussed for congregation. Teams will be vital to getting the work of the church mission done. It was discussed that each Team have a lead and that we have a sign up day for members of the congregation to determine how they would like to be stewards of this congregation.

Teams would include: Worship, Maintenance, CareGivers (Monthly Support), Congregational Care, Missions, Adult Ministry, Children Ministry, Technology, Hospitality, and Fellowship.

Each Board member was asked to reach out and talk with perspective Team Leads and we will finalize at the February meeting. Teams will set their own schedule and submit items/reports to the leadership board chair/recording secretary one week before the Leadership Board Meeting for review.

Generative and Strategic Work

Item 1 – Name Recording Secretary – It was proposed and voted on by 8 members of the board that Kathy Cook be the Board Recording Secretary. Kathy accepted and will serve as the recording secretary of the Leadership Board.

Item 2 – Elect Chair of Trustees – It was proposed and voted on by 8 members of the board that Mike Curran be the Chair of Trustees. This is a requirement of discipline.

Item 3 – Monthly Schedule Calendar

The next meeting will be (March) 20^{th} and we will discuss the metric from last year (budget, attendance, mission, etc.)

Family Activity



During Lent, many of us are reminded once again to examine our lifestyles and ask, "What can we do for others?" Part of faith formation at any age is compassion and offering a serving heart to our neighbors. These past few years have been challenging when trying to find ways to serve our neighbors while remaining physically distant. This time has also reminded us that we need to demonstrate compassion to others now more than ever. Lent is a good time to commit to giving money to a project that helps those in need. One way to involve the whole family is to collect coins during the season of Lent and then following Easter, donate the money. There is a suggested **Coins for Lent Giving Calendar** as a family guide for your use.

If you decide to do this as a family or as a congregation, first determine where you would like your money to go. Regardless of their age, let everyone have a voice. Maybe you have a community food bank that could use funds to purchase food for the hungry. Perhaps you could contribute to a larger project beyond your local community. Locally the Community Emergency Fund (baldwincommunityemergencyfund@gmail.com). Once you have selected a project, decide what coins you want to collect. You may want to contribute a quarter for every item on the giving calendar. You may want to simply collect loose change and give whatever coins you have for each item

Now make a container to collect the money. Use a plastic tub, jar, or a coin bank that you aren't currently using in your home. Decorate it and place it where the entire family can see it (and contribute to it).

Sample of items on the daily guide will remind us of all we have and how little others may have. Each Sunday, you can pray as a family for the project and the people who will benefit from your gifts. Our giving begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes with Holy Saturday. During Lent, Sundays are for worship and praise to God and are reflected with a weekly day of prayer. It's not too late to start doing this during the Lent season. Its not too late to start. Majority of the season of Lent is still before us. Follow the **Coins for Lent Giving Calendar** as a guide. Copies are available in the Narthex for pick up.



The Impact of Congregations

Consider the impact of congregations on your own life. Suppose someone could extract from your life all the influences that God has had on you through faith communities. Imagine if you could pull out of your mind and heart all the thousands of sermons you have heard, the tens of thousands of hymns you have sung, the pastoral prayers and personal devotions that have formed you. Remove all the people from your life and memory whom you have come to know and from whom you have learned and with whom you have worked – the pastors, friends, colleagues, laypersons, youth leaders, Sunday school teachers. Extract from your soul all the work projects, the meetings, the conversations, the service initiatives, the soup kitchens, the mission trips, hospital visits and support from others you have experienced. Extract all the weddings and funerals, (confirmation classes), volunteer hours, stewardship campaigns, prayer vigils, children's programs, mission fairs, camp experiences, and youth ministries.

If you could remove from your life all the influences congregations have ever had on you, who would you be? You'd be someone substantially different from who you are now. The congregations to which you have belonged – their people and pastors, their ministries and teachings and program, their worship and service, their music and rituals. Their communities and caring – these have been the means God has used to form who you are. They shaped you. Congregations are primary means by which God reaches down into our lives to work on our behalf. God uses congregations to create us a new, to claim us as God's own, and to call us to God's service. It is through congregations that God's spirit shapes how we understand ourselves, how we relate to our families, how we view community, and how we participate in the world. ~UMC Bishop Robert Schnase, Rio Texas Conference – www.fivepractices.org
