The procedure is almost the same as entering a show like Aquarius except it is free to enter, and you don't have to frame your painting. Also, our online shows are not juried. Every member is welcome to enter. It gives you a good reason to practice taking a great photo of your work and emailing it at the proper resolution to enter the show.

Basic Procedures for Members Entering the Virtual Show

- 1. One (1) original work per member.
- 2. No size requirements.
- 3. Members will vote for the winners.
- 4. Email a jpeg (at least 200 dpi), include your name and the name of your painting.
- 5. Your image should be cropped to show only the painting; no matting, background or frame in the photo.
- 6. No computer modifications.

President's Message

Several years ago Malcolm Gladwell wrote a book called "Outliers". In the book he looks at people who are 'outliers' in their profession. He goes on to explore the factors that contribute to high levels of success, such as opportunity, cultural background, and practice. It challenges the idea that success is purely based on individual talent or merit and provides insights into how to create a culture of success.

The reasons for a person's success in any field comes down to many things. The concept that struck me the most was the number of hours professionals spend on developing their talent. Gladwell discusses the need to have a minimum of **10,000 hours of practice**. I was surprised to find out that Michael Jordan would spend hours outside as a child playing basketball. I just always assumed he came by it naturally.

In reading this I am reminded of what every artist of every watercolor workshop we have had has told us. "If you want to improve you have to paint." So many of us are so afraid of 'making a mistake' that we don't even get started. I remember at one of our workshops the instructor ac-

tually took a full sheet of watercolor paper, crumpled it and threw it away saying, "It's just paper". He was trying to help us overcome the fear of painting.

I would like to offer to you the benefit of our Monday Morning Painters group. We are all on our own path to 'success' in watercolor painting. Some have been painting for years and others have been painting for a month. The idea is to get together with like-minded people to explore your creativity and play. We also have a time for a critique. This allows us to learn how to improve and to also get ideas on how others approach their work. If you are not comfortable displaying your work that is okay too. I promise you will come away with new ideas and friends.




April 30 – Pop-Up Instant Gallery

This is last October's General Business Meeting. We elected new Board of Director Officers, had a pot luck lunch and enjoyed participating in an instant "Pop-Up Gallery".



Introducing Our New Editor for the CCWS Newsletter!



Sandy McNeil has been a member of CCWS since 2017. She paints with the Monday Morning Painters and received her Signature Membership in 2022.

With no publishing experience or background to rely on, she has bravely volunteered to take over the production of this newsletter. Sandy and I are working together so she can learn the software that I have been using to produce this

newsletter. A high-end publishing application, it has lots of tools that make it easy to achieve a professional look. Plus she will have all the newsletters from the past eight years for reference and the recent ones to use as templates. Sandy has stated that she likes the newsletter the way it is but I am sure once she gets up to speed on producing it, she will put her own spin on it. At least I hope so; it should evolve. Below is her bio in her own words.

"People who know me well would say I come by my artistic talent naturally. However, I didn't take up my brushes until recently. While I have lived on California's Central Coast for most of my life, originally, I lived near Cleveland, Ohio. I graduated from Miami University (Oxford, Ohio) with a BS in International Studies. I went back to school in Albuguergue NM to take accounting classes, passed the CPA exam, and went to work for 30+ years as an accountant because the work was math-oriented, challenging, and mostly portable.

When I vacated my Orcutt, CA accounting office in 2016 in search of my second life, I signed up for the first of a handful of classes at Allan Hancock College. My biggest take-away from "The Joy of Drawing" class? Sketch something – anything – every day. Sketching on a daily basis easily lends itself to journaling and, since 2017, that has been my daily challenge: to sketch or do some small piece of artwork *every* day in addition to the journaling. I have accumulated no less than 40 Moleskine Journals, full of artwork rendered in pencil (graphite), charcoal, ink, colored pencils, pastels, coffee, and of course, watercolor. Nowadays, this challenge is an excuse to get out of the house and have an adventure.

As the incoming CCWS Newsletter Editor, I am hopeful and undaunted. For Dail, this transition is huge; she has worked unceasingly to create a beautiful newsletter. With your help, we'll keep it going."


