F. Additional Tips from Feature Resident, Gerry Boocock: Frustrated with trying to clean out the condensate line on your A/C? If you have the original unit(s)in your condo, you can use a product called ProTreat which can be added to the condensate tray in the unit by removing the screws and pulling the tray out about 1 inch:





The directions suggest a pill for each 3 tons of A/C which is stated on the Manufacturers plate on the front of the unit. We have been using it for about 9 years with no problems. It's important to do this as the line could back up and cause a leak.
