WANTED!

As seen in the photos below, several juveniles have been riding their motorized bikes and scooters in various pocket parks throughout Montevista destroying grass and damaging irrigation lines. This vandalism has already cost Montevista residents several thousands of dollars for repairs!

A police report has been filed and our Community Action Offficer, Officer Jeffrey Blair with the Black Mountain Precinct, has been notified. In addition, we are hoping to get an increase in police patrols for our community and surrounding areas. Photos of some of these suspected juveniles have been posted on the Montevista Facebook page (not a Board-sanctioned entity for disseminating information) and on Nextdoor.

In order to be held liable for their actions, such vandals must be caught in the act. We are thus asking residents to be vigilant when driving/walking through Montevista and video this behavior if seen while noting the specific location, date and time of day. It is best not to confront the perpetrators as they can simply ride off or cause a confrontation that may result in further harm.

With a microchip, if your pet is ever lost and picked up by a Maricopa County Animal Control Officer, they can get a ride home that very same day! If unable to reach you at your home address, your pet will be held at the shelter for a minimum of five days, allowing you more time to reunite with your precious furbaby.

INVASION OF THE TARANTULA



LOOK FAMILIAR? THIS WESTERN DESERT TARANTULA, AKA THE ARIZONA BLOND TARANTULA, HAS BEEN SPOTTED AROUND MONTEVISTA DESPITE BEING FAIRLY HARD TO SPOT AND RARELY SEEN; BUT, THERE IS NO NEED TO PANIC! THESE LARGE, HAIRY SPIDERS ARE MOST ACTIVE RIGHT BEFORE SUNSET AND DURING THE NIGHT. THEY TEND TO LIVE IN BURROWS, UNDERNEATH ROCKS AND IN CAVES.

TARANTULAS ARE THE LARGEST SPECIES OF SPIDERS IN ARIZONA. THEY DO POSSESS FANGS AND ARE VENOMOUS, BUT THEY ARE NOT AGGRESSIVE, AND WITH GENTLE HANDLING DO NOT BECOME AGITATED AND POSE NO THREAT. THEY DO NOT BITE UNLESS SERIOUSLY PROVOKED; IN FACT, THERE ARE NO RECORDS OF SERIOUS HARM TO HUMANS RESULTING FROM THEIR BITE. AS SUCH, THIS VERY DOCILE SPECIES OF TARANTULA MAKES THEM IDEAL FOR FIRST-TIME PET OWNERS!

Recipe of the Month Mini Turkey Brownie Desserts







INGREDIENTS:

1/4 cup butter, softened
1/2 cup white sugar
1 large egg
1/2 tsp vanilla extract
1/4 cup all-purpose flour
3 tbsp unsweetened cocoa
powder
1/8 tsp baking powder

FROSTING:

1/8 tsp salt

3 tbsp butter, softened 3 tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder 1-1/2 tbsp milk 1 cup powdered sugar

DECORATION:

24 candy eyeballs 12 red candy-coated pieces (such as M&Ms) 60 candy corn, or as needed.

SUBSTITIONS/CHEATS:

Sugar Bowl Bakery Brownie Bites - Costco Store-bought frosting

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350. Spray a 12-cup mini muffin tin with cooking spray.

Cream butter and sugar together in a bowl with an electric mixer. Add egg and vanilla; mix well. Stir flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, and salt together in a separate bowl. Add flour mixture to butter mixture and mix until batter is smooth. Divide batter evenly among muffin cups.

Bake about 14 minutes until a toothpick inserted into center comes out clean. Cool in tin for 5 minutes. Transfer too wire rack and cool about 20 minutes.

Prepare the frosting - combine butter, cocoapowder, and milk in a bowl and mix with an electric mixer until smooth. Slowly add powdered sugar and mix until frosting is smooth and fluffy. Spoon into a piping bag with a Wilton #10 tip.

Pipe a circle of frosting near the bottom half of each brpwnie to create the turkey's head. Add two candy eyes. Add one red chocolate piece to form the beak. Pipe five lines of frosting in the shape of a semi-circle coming up from the head. Place a piece of candy corn on each of the five lines to form the turkey feathers.
