Spring is Here

THANK YOU: A BIG thank you to Dale Wince for installing the new security lighting in the pavilion at the main beach. Dale donated his time and all of the materials! This is a big savings and a huge help to keep the area safe. We are grateful for his donation to the community.

LAWN CARE/MAINTENANCE: A HUGE thank you to Michael Varesko-Dean for volunteering to maintain the grounds of the community properties for 2021! We hope to use the savings to make needed improvements in the neighborhood.

MOSQUITOS: The most effective way to control mosquitoes is at the community level. Spraying will start in May. Prevention: give your yards a once over and eliminate standing water in and around the house. Mosquitoes can breed in containers as small as a bottle cap, even with only ½" of water. Every week, empty and scrub items that hold water such as birdbaths & containers under plants which can potentially become a breeding farm for mosquitos.

Community Reminders

- With the changing of the season, we need to be very careful while we are out in the neighborhood. Please adhere to the basic safety guidelines and *PLEASE WATCH YOUR SPEED*.
- Our streets are narrow, please keep the roadways clear.
- Bicycles, skateboarders, golf carts, and scooters must obey street signs.
- Pedestrians, please stay to the side of the road facing oncoming traffic.
- Pets must be on a leash and please pick-up after them.
- When removing your boats from the water, DO NOT power onto your trailer. This causes the dirt to be moved away from the slab of the ramp which, over time, will damage boat trailers.

- We have been informed that the State of Maryland has not given final approval for the loan to start the next phase of water lines in the community. The project was approved in 2019; however, we are waiting on funding for the final phase to be completed. Please call your state representative at 301-858-3170 and 301-858-3227 to voice your concerns about the delay in funding the project.
- There have been a number of packages stolen from mailboxes over the past month. The Sheriff's Department and the Postmaster have been notified and there is an open investigation. If you have been the victim of stolen mail/packages, please call the Postmaster at 800-275-8777 and the Sheriff's Department at 301-475-8008.
- Also, we have had reports of stray dogs and numerous feral cats roaming the neighborhood. Please call Animal Control at 301-475-2500.
