# Membership Dues

It is time to renew your dues for the 2023/2024 year. Your dues matter! For only \$65 a year, you can enjoy the many amenities in your community and have peace of mind that the community properties are being maintained. Many people are shocked that our community offers so much for only \$65 a year. They comment about how beautiful the beach is, how nice the pier and pavilion are with the new seating areas and paved walkway, they rave about the convenience of having two boat ramps, the serenity that the remembrance garden offers, and they envy our community fellowship events. Let's continue to be proud of what we have and invest in keeping our community clean, well-maintained, and a great place to live.

We were able to accomplish a tremendous amount of improvements last year due to your generosity. Thank you to our many volunteers for donating their time and materials when they were able. Going into 2023, we have much more to do to make our community great. Below is a snapshot of the 2022 budget:

There are 296 households in our community. Last year, there were 169 paying members. This brought our total dues income to \$10,140.00 and with the basic yearly expenses constantly increasing, we needed to raise the dues and ask more in the community to pay your dues. It's easy to see how much you all have so generously contributed to make beautiful improvements to the community and we THANK YOU! But we need to start being realistic about the needed repairs to the community pier and boat ramps. These will be very big upcoming expenses.

We hope that those of you who paid your dues last year and enjoyed the amenities, that you will again pay your dues in 2023. For those of you who have not joined us, please consider paying your dues. This is the <u>ONLY</u> way you are able to enjoy the community properties. The beach, pier, pavilion, boat ramps, and remembrance garden <u>are for dues paying</u> <u>members ONLY</u>.

We will discuss fundraising ideas at the Spring Meeting on May 20 at 2:00 p.m. at the beach and ask that you bring a side dish to share. Please join us as we work together to brainstorm ideas. It takes a village – or in our case – a waterfront community to get the job done!

Please keep in mind that in 2022, we saved a great deal of money by having so many people volunteer their time, tools, supplies, and materials as a donation to your community. This is a huge savings to the budget and we are grateful. Please let us know if you would like to help with upcoming projects. The more, the merrier!

## Community Concerns

**Drainage:** We have been in contact with the County in reference to the drainage problem in our community. They are still in the planning process but we are on track to see some movement. The engineers have completed their work and the County is in discussions with the contractors. We are excited to see the plans in the near future and will keep you all updated.

**Golf Carts:** Delegate Matt Morgan introduced HB 219 and the bill cleared the House on March 20. We have been in contact with Delegate Matt Morgan's office and Delegate Todd Morgan's office to track the bill. They have both been incredibly helpful and we will continue to track the progress of the bill in the Senate and share the outcome as soon as we know more.
