Did you know about the Saints: On January 31, we celebrate the feast of Saint Don Bosco (1815 - 1888). As a young Priest in Turin, Italy, he saw a great need to help young people which is why he founded the Salesian Society for young men and the Salesian Sisters for young woman. His educational approach centered on reason, religion, and kindness. Don Bosco's mother also helped him with caring for the marginalized youth and was known affectionately as Mamma Margherita. Kindness and understanding were at the heart of all of Don Bosco's efforts, but he would also teach caution against temptation. Don Bosco would say that "the most powerful weapon to conquer the devil is humility, for as he (the devil) does not know at all how to employ it, neither does he know how to defend himself from it." Don Bosco was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1934.

Pastor's Note: Living with God's **authority....**On this fourth Sunday in Ordinary time, we continue to journey with Jesus, as he goes about carrying out his mission. Last Sunday we saw Jesus beginning his ministry by proclaiming the Kingdom of God and calling the early Apostles to join in his mission. This Sunday we see Jesus beginning his teaching ministry by entering the Synagogue and teaches with authority. The teaching of Jesus in the synagogue is presented as a fulfillment of the promise God made to the people of Israel. In the first reading, from the Book of Deuteronomy, we see the promise of God to give the people a prophet like Moses, who will speak in the name of the Lord. It is stressed that the words spoken by that future prophet will be what God wants him to speak. It is this aspect of speaking what God wants him to speak, that gives the prophet the authority to teach. If, on the other hand, the prophet speaks his own words, rather than what God wants him to speak, he will experience death. That Jesus speaks the words of God, as directed by God, is made known in the way unclean spirits proclaim Jesus as 'the Holy one of God.' The power of God enables Jesus to defeat unclean spirits and to have mastery over them. Mark presents Jesus as one who speaks with authority. This authority is definitely the result of Jesus speaking the words God the Father wants him to speak. Jesus thus becomes that prophet as promised by God, someone like Moses. People see him teaching with authority, and they marvel at him. This is Mark's way of presenting Jesus as the new Moses. The Responsorial Psalm conveys the response we are called to have towards the teaching of Jesus. It is our responsibility to hear the words of God and to respond to that with total generosity. We cannot be deaf to the call of Jesus to follow him. We have to respond. The second reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians stresses the need to be faithful to Jesus, by making his ways our most important priority. When we follow Jesus, we will be acknowledging his authority as the true messenger of God.
