



S212: WILDLAND FIRE CHAINSAWS

This course will provide the student with basic wildland chainsaw knowledge. The course will consist of one day of classroom/maintenance instruction with chainsaw breakdown and repair. Days two and three will provide students with hands on saw techniques including saw operations and advanced cutting.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- List, define, and apply chain saw safety standards.
- Incorporate the approved use, maintenance, and function of personal protective equipment in Wildland Fire Chainsaw applications.
- Identify basic chain saw parts nomenclature, maintenance, tuning, troubleshooting and safety features.
- Demonstrate field maintenance tasks required for chain saw operation; demonstrate the tactical application of chain saws in brushing, limbing, bucking, and falling for fireline construction and mop-up operations.

Students will be responsible to provide their own chainsaw, extra chains, chaps, Wildland PPE Gear (including helmet, boots, eye/ear protection, pants, and jacket) fuel and bar oil. Additional details sent upon registration.
