Eighth-graders Showcase Science Fair Projects

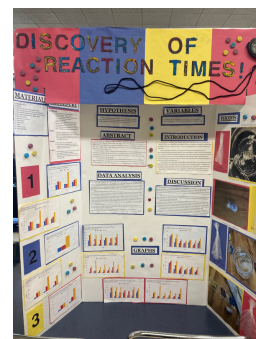
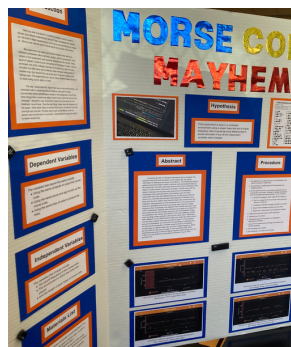
