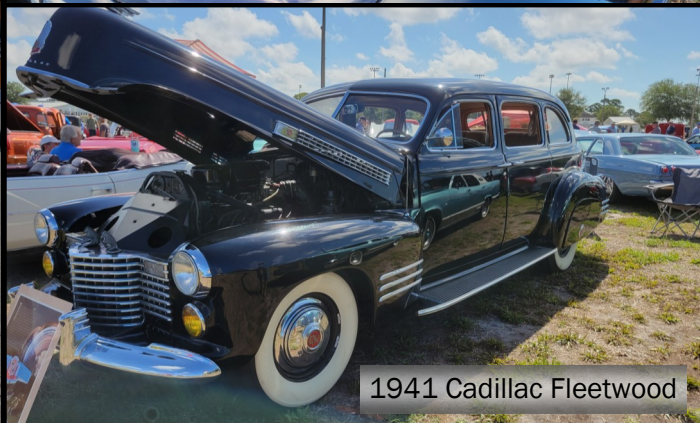

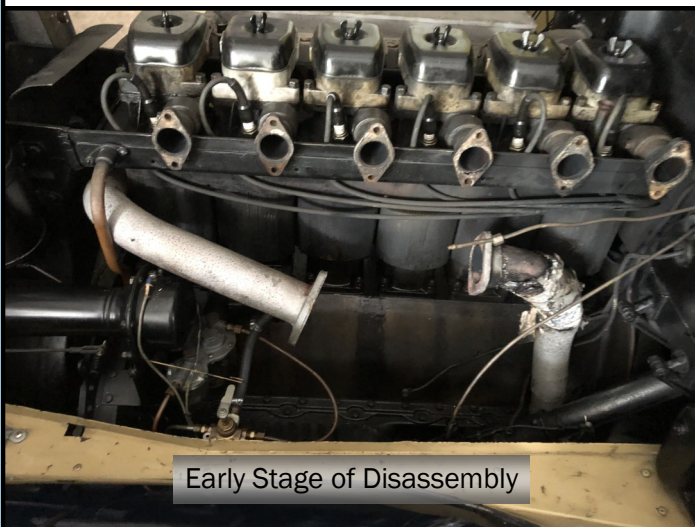

## Fixing a Franklin Motor

A very long story told in as brief a way as possible. I had owned the 1929 Franklin for almost two years when suddenly the engine began to make a previously unheard noise. I sent the car to someone who had experience with Franklins. Getting the parts to fix it took some time. However, in a couple of weeks I did get the car back. I was almost home when another noise began that was louder than the first. I called the mechanic and asked him to let me know when he could schedule it back. I waited for about four weeks and didn't hear anything from him. I was looking at YouTube and discovered a film of a man trying to start a Franklin that had not been started for over 30 years. After watching the film, I decided that it wasn't nearly as complicated as I thought it would be. That was a decision based upon ignorance, I have made similar decisions in the past.

about search for parts. There was a half day of phone conversations with a guy in California, that is a full page story in itself, since these were parts I paid for and never received.



Early Stage of Disassembly

I began to disassemble the engine with some encouragement from a friend and someone else who was introduced to me by that friend. A Franklin is air cooled, so each cylinder is removable separately and because we thought we knew which cylinder was the source of the noise, we started to remove the one we surmised it was. The more we took it apart, the more we discovered it was much more complicated than we had thought. We removed all the cylinders to have the valves ground. I took the cylinders to a machinist in Venice and found that some of the valves needed to be replaced. This was the beginning of the much talked

Engine parts came from upstate New York, New Jersey, someone else in California, and Florida. And this is not a complete list. There was a machine shop in Sarasota and another in upstate New York. There were many delays getting the parts, getting the machining done, finding the energy to do the work, and arranging everyone's schedules to coincide. The project only took 16 months to complete. There is a statement that says some things are best left to the experts, and obviously, I was not an expert.

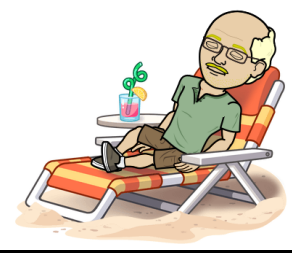


## Editor Comments
