## The One Favorite Car That We Have Owned

It happened before I ever knew Gordon Langenefer! When in high school, he purchase a 1931 Chevrolet roadster for \$75, and his father was very upset about it! He did not want that old car in his driveway! Gordon put a Corvette engine in the car and drove it back and forth to high school. In the fall of 1958, when it was time for College, Gordon parked the car in his sister's basement garage, and it remained there for many years.

A short history of the car: it belonged to a Long Island sea captain who had named the '31 Chevy, "Eloise," and placed a big "E" on the front bumper. Several

months after Gordon took his new acquisition to his home in Port Jefferson, the sea captain passed away. It was queried that perhaps he died of a broken heart, having parted with his beloved "Eloise!"

After college Gordon married his May Queen sweetheart, moved to Ohio, then New York, and then to New

Hampshire where he was finally reunited with his roadster. Gordon trailered it to his garage In Peterborough where he began the painstaking task of a complete restoration. Although there was no AACA region in New Hampshire, Gordon joined National and subsequently took his fully restored vehicle to many meets in the east, securing his first Junior, Senior, and many Preservation awards.

Gordon and Linda went on many tours including Glidden Tours in Kentucky and as far away as Arizona, all the while enjoying their "Eloise." Although the big "E" had long ago been removed, during all the

years of Gordon's ownership, everyone "in the know" referred to the '31 roadster as "Eloise," and some car hobbyists even to this day remember her fondly. Gordon's son, Scott, and his daughter, Sheri, as youngsters, spent many hours in the car's rumble seat. Sheri had the job of dusting "Eloise," and both were very careful to only put their foot on the step plate when maneuvering into the "back seat!"

During the years of car tours and meets, Gordon developed an interest in brass era cars, especially EMFs! The day finally arrived when he sold "Eloise" to a gentleman from Shelter Island. Yes the "favorite"

car returned to Long Island, from whence it had come. Although it was difficult for Gordon to "let go" of his award winning "coffee cream and celini green" antique automobile, it gave him the time needed to pursue his desire for a brass era car, the first being a 1911 EMF 30 touring.

His quest for the brass era cars and a membership in the HCCA (Horseless Carriage Club of America where all cars on national tours have to be pre-1916) clinched Gordon's newest area of interest in the old car hobby. However, the 1931 Chevrolet roadster, "Eloise" provided us with many memories of fun times, including exposure to beautiful areas of our country, and its latest home in Florida, before returning to its original one in New York. "Eloise" will always remain a special "honorary member" of the Langenefer family!

The 76th Revival AAA Glidden Tour held September 25-30 in Princeton, NJ. was sponsored by the New Jersey Region AACA with assistance from the South Jersey Region. For those arriving early, directions for self-guided walking tours of historic Princeton were available. The opening afternoon BBQ banquet was held at the Woods Edge Farm featuring a herd of over 300 llamas, alpacas, and yaks producing fine yarns sold in the U.S. and around the world. Tour Chairman Vince DeLisi welcomed all the participants and acknowledged AACA and VMCCA National Officers in attendance. Following an excellent meal, drivers headed to the impressive vehicle collection and grounds of Mike & Diane Strober for coffee and

desserts including a Good Humor Ice Cream truck filled with a variety of treats. It was then off to the host hotels to begin five full days of touring starting Monday with about 125 vehicles registered. Monday 9/25 began with a trip to the Mercer County Community College's Kelsey Theater to have a presentation lecture of the "Ten Crucial Days" of the

Revolutionary War highlighting New Jersey's important role in the conduct of the war. It was then off to Bucks County, PA for a series of covered bridge drive throughs. Lunch was provided at the picturesque Nockamixon State Park. Optional stops on this day tour were Peddlers Village in Lahaska and New Hope in PA and Lambertville and Flemington in NJ featuring antique shops, restaurants, wineries etc as well as other local attractions. Returning to the hotels for dinner on your own, the mileage for the day was 120. Tuesday began with travel through several pristine NJ counties to Erwinna, PA to visit the Van Sant Historic Airfield hangers featuring numerous vintage aircraft.

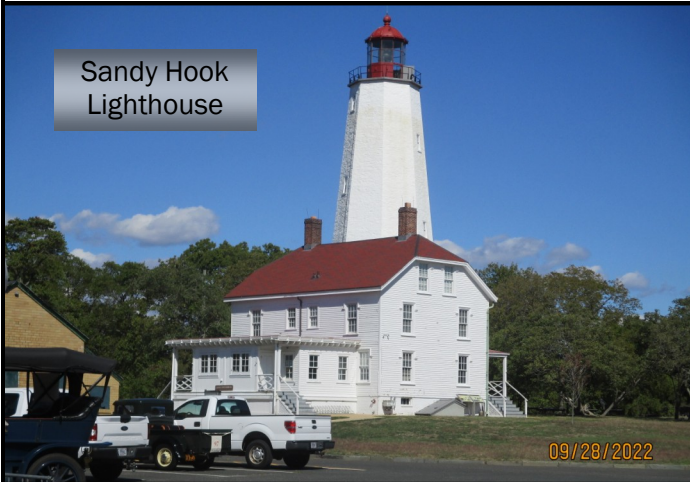

This was also the coffee & baked goods spot for the day. Continuing on the next stop was Washington Crossing (PA) Historic Park being the site where General George Washington crossed the Delaware River in 1776 to capture the city of Trenton. There is an excellent museum and historic out buildings to explore. The final stop was the Washington Crossing (NJ) State Park where lunch was served and another ice cream truck provided treats. There is a visitor center, museum and walking trails to enjoy. A park staff member in costume loaded and fired a vintage musket used by Americans in the war. Heading back to Princeton, 100 miles were covered.

Wednesday featured visiting Monmouth Battlefield State Park where there was a presentation by the Park's Historian regarding the days of fighting in 1778. The museum is well done and walking the battlefield was an option. It was then on to the Sandy Hook section of Gateway National Recreation Center

operated by the National Park Service. Lunch was provided by McFlays Restaurant and the site contains the Sandy Hook Lighthouse built in 1764 being the oldest operating lighthouse in the U.S. The U.S. Army

operated Fort Hancock from 1850 to 1974 and part of its responsibilities was to defend New York Harbor. The evening activity consisted of the traditional Freshman graduation held at the East Windsor Elks Club following a cookout dinner. Dean of Freshman Pat Swigart presided over the event and freshman were to complete an initiation ritual to receive their diplomas. Total miles for the day was 117. Thursday started with a drive to the Roebling Museum where John Roebling engineered and manufactured steel wire cable used in building the Brooklyn and San Francisco Bridges. Other applications were utilized in deep mines, shipbuilding, elevators, aircraft and communications worldwide. Instead of driving to the busy city of Camden, tourists rode on the NJ Transit

light rail to visit the USS New Jersey battleship. On board, a lunch was served on the deck and several tour routes could be utilized to explore this famous vessel. The ship is the most decorated in US Naval history operating from WW II through Middle East conflicts serving for over 50 years retired in 1991. Another ice cream truck arrived before heading back and 56 miles were driven today.

Friday's focus was on the Battle of Princeton with an excellent narration of the battle by a history expert. The New Jersey National Guard Museum in

Lawrenceville is relatively new and is filled with artifacts from the Revolutionary War to the most recent conflicts involving US servicemen & women. Taking a scenic route to Somerset County, a Polish style meal for lunch was provided at the Knob Hill Grove Park pavilion. Preparing for the evening closing banquet, participants headed back early. 50 miles were traveled today.

## Road Trip to North Carolina

We attended two car shows, the Southeast British Car Festival at the Dillard House in Dillard, GA, and Autumn in The Mountains in Mills River, NC. The Dillard Show was put on by The Peach Tree MG Register of the Atlanta area. This was an all-British Show of mostly MG's. One of our Suncoast British Car Club members Steve Phillips and his wife Patti won a first in the rubber bumper class. The Dillard House is a beautiful place for a car show, with the mountain back drop and great winding roads to get there.

The last weekend we attended the Autumn in the Mountains in Mills River, NC. This was a European car show put on by the British Car Club of Western North Carolina and was held at the Mills River Brewing Co. Over 200 European cars were entered, including a gorgeous Alfa Romeo Giulietta Sprint Speciale, very low production vehicle worth around \$125,000.

The Trust General Store is truly in the middle of nowhere but has a gourmet chef preparing unbelievable and unique dishes served in an old general store. 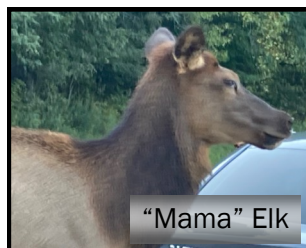

## Editor Comments

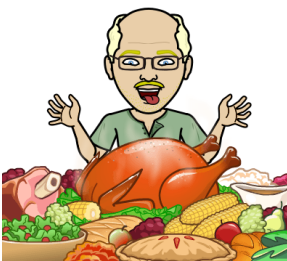
Most of you are aware that I will be leaving the position of Newsletter Editor. The following is the message I sent to the Board of Director on October 13:
