THE PASTOR'S EPISTLE "God's Wise Plans"

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." – Romans 8:28

How does God work?

He works for the good of those who love him. In other words, God will bring good out of the most horrible circumstances according to his will.

How many of you have ever heard of Corrie Ten Boom? Corrie was a Dutch watchmaker who, along with her family, hid Jews during the Holocaust. It was during that time that her family and her were arrested by the Nazis for helping the Jews and sent to a concentration camp. After the Ten Booms arrest, Corrie's father Casper died. Sometime later, her sister Betsie died as well.

Not only did Corrie lose two of her family members during this time, but she spent time in solitary confinement, scoffed at because she felt mentally ill people were valuable in the eyes of God, and spent much of her time in concentration camps and a women's labor camp. It was at the women's labor camp that Corrie and her sister Betsie, before she died, shared the Good News with their fellow prisoners. Many of their fellow prisoners converted to Christianity because of what Corrie and Betsie did.

Just before Betsie died, she told Corrie, "There is no pit so deep that [God] is not deeper still." Twelve days later after Betsie's death, Corrie was released. It was soon after her release that Corrie learned that all the women in her age group at the camp were sent to the gas chamber.

God had a wise plan for Corrie's life. Though it included some very rough parts, God came to the best end possible for everyone.

And this may be hard for some of you to read. As some of you have faced some of the hardest times in your lives. Times that you may have asked God, why? Why did you allow this person to get sick? Why did you take this person from me so early? Why did you allow this person to hurt me? Why do I have to face what I'm facing right now?

If this is you, my heart hurts for you. As I understand some of your pain. And I'm sorry that you have faced this difficulty in your life. But I want to reassure you that God's wise plan for your life will never change. He will always bring the best out of the worst circumstances. So, continue to trust in God.

As Corrie Ten Boom once said, "When a train goes through a tunnel and it gets dark, you don't throw away the ticket and jump off. You sit still and trust the engineer."

So, trust God as he is the wise engineer driving your life in the direction he has planned for you. Despite the bumps and turns, our wise God is in control.

Pressures, demands, expectations, and tasks push in from all sides and assault our schedules. Do this! Be there! Finish that! Call them! Everyone seems to want something from us – family, friends, employer, school, church, clubs. Soon we have little left to give as we run out of energy and time. MISSIONS!



"Uniquely restoring every community with the good news of Jesus Christ."

Katie and my ears perked up when we heard the above new vision statement for Cru City. It affirmed the variety of tactics we employ to bring each community closer to understanding and loving Jesus. For some in poverty, it is the effects they encounter of an unjust circumstances that need restoring. For others, it is the loneliness of living in a new place that a Christ followers can address. For everyone, this ultimately points to the love and sacrifice of Jesus. Here is a sample of what we have engaged in at the community center at 42nd and Pine as well as across the city.

Hosting Welcome Parties: Global Connect, my former role before City, hosted 100 new International students at the community center our church owns.

Toddler FreePlay: One group that is often lonely in University City are the spouses of scholars. Many from abroad cannot study or work in America. For those with kids, these highly capable people live's suddenly slow down in a new country. This weekly time at our church's community center allows new parents to connect with Christians in a safe, neutral setting.

Yoga: A woman from church will soon be launching a yoga class at the community center.

I hope to utilize this yoga class to have members of my church connect with the community, and for neighbors to enter a space that is far less intimidating than a church.

Homeless: For other communities, physical needs are at the front of their minds. These include the hungry that are fed at the community center every Friday evening. Katie's work in Kensington seeks to bring dignity and clothing to women living on the streets.

School: Katie tutors kids who are struggling to read in North Philly. Via zoom over the summer tutoring was able to continue. One day last month she asked her student if he was excited for school to start. He said he was and Katie asked why. He responded "Cause I can't wait to work with you again in person."

After this, Katie organized a cleanup of the trash filled lot next to the school. She did not want her students or others to see such signs of brokenness and neglect on their way to their first day of school on August 29th.
