“FROM THE PASTOR’S STUDY”

The apostle Paul astonishingly says, “For if we have been *united* with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His” (Rom 6:5). A more literal translation would read, “For if we have been *organically planted* in a death like His, certainly His resurrection!”

Of course, it is not the idea that having been united with Christ through faith that we shall also be united with Him in all things – especially future resurrection– that is so astonishing. God is faithful to His promises. He offers more than a temporal or partial connection, but rather an enduring and unending relationship. We know that already! Rather, what is shocking is Paul’s word choice to describe that mysterious reality.

The Greek word most of us read as “united” in our translations has no real dynamic equivalent in English. We understand “united” as joined, welded together, married, combined, et al. *σύνφυτοι*, certainly carries the idea of two things once apart now being connected, but it means so much more. *σύνφυτοι* implies a *living* connection, two organic active lives previously separate now brought together. That is so odd on many accounts. I mean...to use a word that means *planted together life* to describe our connection with Christ’s *death* is more than just a bit ironic is it not?

Think about that, *two living things united in a singular death*. Death results in dissolution, separation, disorder, and estrangement, but our organic connection to the True and Living God accomplishes just the opposite of that. It’s mind-boggling.

I think Paul chose *σύνφυτοι* with a wry smile on his face. He was a master craftsman with words, and in the whole New Testament *σύνφυτοι* just might be the most brilliant stroke of Paul’s poetic pen. He was mocking death when he wrote it. The word suggests everything but death. It is a playful and enchanting word, one that is designed to produce more in us than simple charming thoughts. It is a word that we can call upon in the trenches when the days grow dark and the battle against internal sin rages on relentlessly. *σύνφυτοι* is truly a word of hope!

The Bible is not an abstract, fancy, “full of daisies” message. No, it sees things as they are. The apostles and prophets knew that life can be brutal, cruel, and ruthless. People face unemployment, rejection, the absence of loved ones, and the loss of dreams. I imagine there are a million other things you yourself can think of. Yet take heart, you have been united in some mysterious life-giving way to Christ’s death, and so will be joined with Him in His glorious resurrection. Death has no power over the Christian, and although its effects are still quite grim, it is not something we should lose heart over. Christ has overcome the worst of it for us. We were mysteriously joined with Him when He died for us and now His life in us overcomes the worst of our present circumstances.

This is the great meaning of Easter, or as I like to call it, Resurrection Sunday. And it is not a message we should just keep for ourselves. Go, and tell the whole world!

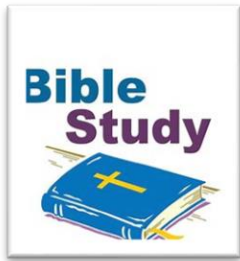

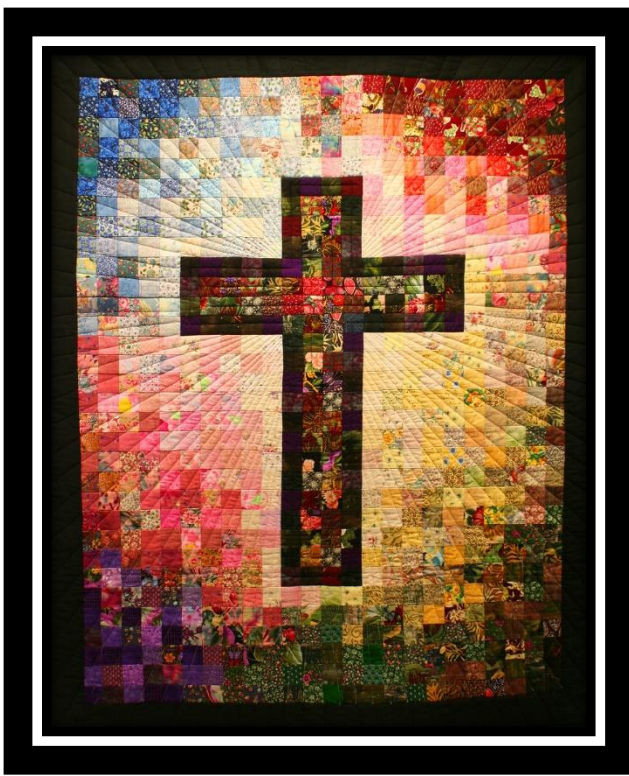

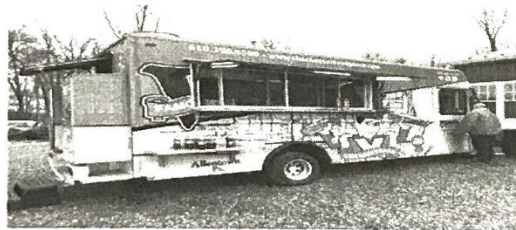
