## † “FROM THE PASTOR’S STUDY” †

### The Bigger Story

When Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the crowds were shouting, “Hosanna, blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!” Mark records this in the 11th chapter of his gospel. The phrase they shouted comes from Psalm 118, a Psalm eventually put in the Psalter as part of the Great Hallel, the songs the Jews sang at Passover recounting the nation’s deliverance from Egypt when the LORD destroyed Pharaoh’s army.

That wonderful Psalm opens with an exhortation to the house of Aaron, the priestly clan, to join the Psalmist in praise of the LORD. Then he begins to recount a recent time of great distress when the LORD delivered him mightily. It was a military deliverance for verse ten depicts the surrounding nations attacking Israel. Suddenly, “in the name of the LORD,” the king was able to cut them off in the waning moments of a battle when all hope seemed lost.

Of course, great victories like this require subsequent praise of the Deliverer so the Psalmist begins to recount that celebration (vv. 14–18). The praise was robust and ecstatic. It resounded throughout the households of the righteous. Rising above his countrymen’s triumphant cries, the Psalmist shouts, “I shall not die, but I shall live and recount the deeds of the LORD. The LORD has disciplined me severely, but He has not given me over to death.” The king had offended God and by so doing invited God’s corrective discipline on himself and the nation, so his praise appropriately included an acknowledgment of sin.

Then leading a “praise parade” to the entrance of the tabernacle or temple (depending on how one dates the Psalm), the king calls for the opening of the “gates of righteousness” so the victory party can continue their celebratory worship before God. As they enter, they sing, “Hosanna!” Actually, “hôšî’â nâ’,” a transliteration of two Hebrew words which means, “Save now,” or “Save please!”

So, all this makes sense, right? The crowds of Jesus’ day, seeing a pattern in history, are quoting Scripture about a past military victory the LORD granted Israel. God delivered at the Red Sea, God saved David and the nation when he was in distress; and they wanted an equal –or even grander– victory in their day. The Romans were unequalled in combat prowess, and relentless in punishing challengers. In a moment when all hope seemed lost, suddenly a miracle worker came to town. He is riding on a donkey like the prophets said He would. This must be the time. “You have done it before God, do it again! Save now, save now, save now!”

Then Jesus does something astonishing. He quotes back the exact same Psalm saying, “The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. This is the LORD’s doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.” Later words in the same Psalm read, “Bind the festal sacrifice with cords, up to the horns of the altar!”

What is going on! They interpreted the mission of God as an external salvation only, because as God's chosen people they assumed they were righteous. Jesus dampened their joy saying their cry for salvation was really a rejection of Him because they refused to acknowledge their sin! Wanting God's peace, joy, and goodness without first admitting we do not have those things because we have fallen away from Him is hypocrisy. "Save now," should mean "save us from our greatest enemy...death." Remember David's confession, "The LORD disciplined me severely." This is a clue pointing us to what our deepest understanding and attitude should be. Our biggest problem is not "out there." Sin is in our hearts. We need saved from that. That is the bigger story Jesus is trying to tell us all. Hosanna! ~Soli Deo Gloria~

## AUGUST 7, 2023

Pastor Stan opened in prayer and devotion.

1. Visitors – Brett Biggs provided a financial investment update regarding current income accounts and bonds.
2. Property Report – Dave reports the repairs to the church’s roof have been completed; the Schlegel family has completed their move and the property has been cleaned out; dust in the furnace room is being tested. Jared reports he is looking into possible options for the doors/locks/keys of the church; two quotes for paving behind the activity center have been received, planning to acquire a third quote; the basement storage area has been cleaned out and the upstairs preschool storage room will be cleaned out shortly. There is a large wasps nest in the youth group storage closet that needs to be removed.
3. Youth Group – Will reports he has been meeting with Stan to coordinate two youth group evenings per week starting in the fall and establish a set curriculum; Sunday morning bible study has a regular attendance of three to four students; Friday night bible study is currently reading through the book of Romans.
4. Young Adults Bible Study – Stan reports he has reached out to the men of the group, awaiting responses.
5. Collaborative Discipleship Program Summary (CDPS) – Kevin Dellicker discussed three related subjects: church campus improvements, doctrine and theology, and Christian education. The Elders agreed to discuss a facilitated planning session to align the church properties with church missions. They also agreed to work with Pastor Stan to develop a committee on church theology, to make sure Jacobs Church has consistent and transparent theology. No action was taken on Christian education.
6. Confirmation – Stan reports he will be taking lead of the confirmation class when it returns from summer break on September 17<sup>th</sup>.
7. Childrens Church – Diane reports the need for additional teachers in order to have two separate classes based on age.
8. Church Office Development – Stan’s office will be temporarily in the upper room of the church balcony.
9. Pew Bible Replacement – Diane reports she has ordered the new bibles and they should be arriving within the next week.
10. IT Director Search – We are looking for a new IT Director! Please visit the Jacob’s Church website to submit your Application, Statement of Faith and References. Ron reports there are currently no applicants.
