The 'blessing' of a church family. These are the people you sing with; pray with; laugh with; cry with; fellowship with; worship with; minister with; and hold on to through the good and the tuff times. Look into their faces and you can see God's love pouring into your soul.

With today's technology we can do so much online in the comfort of our homes. We can even go to church online and never make it into the actual pew. But how much do we miss when we're not there in person? Can we see the smiles; the tears; feel the hugs? We miss so much of God's blessing by not gathering together. Yesterday was Palm Sunday. Pastor Dan asked "how would you tell someone else what Palm Sunday is about?" He showed this picture of the journey that you would have to

have walked from Jericho up to Jerusalem. The trip would take you from -720 feet below sea level to 2600 feet above to the top of Mount Olive in a little over 14 mile hike. But the road isn't straight up. There are dips and valleys along the way. Much like our road in life. When we get to the top of the hill we look over the Kidron valley to the destination of Jerusalem. From on top of that hill we can look over to the rise on the other side and see (currently) where the temple would have stood. In Jesus' day the temple would be directly in front of you. I remember standing at the top of that hill and looking over the valley. At the very bottom of the hill (before you cross the valley) is a garden. The Garden of Gethsemane.

This is where Jesus came with his disciples after the "Last Supper." He came with his friends to pray. Jesus knew the "Valley of the Shadow of Death" that he was about to face. Did he want to go through it? No. He prayed "My Father! If it is possible, let this cup of suffering be taken away from me." He knew what he was going to have to suffer. But he continued praying, "Yet YOUR will be done, not mine." As I stand at the top of the Mount and look over the valley to what is on the other side, what is my prayer? Do I ask God to give me a miracle and take my cancer away? If he doesn't, do I curse him and sink into depression because he didn't do 'my will?' If he did take it away, what 'blessings' would I miss out on because I didn't have to cross that valley? What if he would have answered Jesus' prayer? What if he didn't have to suffer and die on the cross. What HOPE would we have today? We live in such a fallen world, is death and disease all we have to look forward to? I certainly hope not!
