St. Cecilia, offer our songs to the Lord. O Mary Help of Christians, pray for us.






What are some ways you and your family worships God?

"The second commandment enjoins respect for the Lord's name. The name of the Lord is holy" (CCC2161).


The Second Commandment




The Fifth Commandment


You shall not kill.




The Sixth Commandment


The Seventh Commandment



For ANY Holy Bible, Catechism, textbook, make sure to look for the official inscription by a Bishop: "Imprimatur" & "Nihil Obstat." (This is the official declaration that the information are accurate & follow Church Teachings).
