Often the amount of the loan payment is offset by energy savings.

Togetherwesave.com has a list of energy efficiency ideas for you to consider. Eligible projects include new heat pumps with a minimum 15 SEER rating, new electric or solar water heaters, ENERGY STAR replacement windows and doors, insulation of all types, and duct repair or replacement.

If you own your home served by the cooperative, receive a monthly electric bill and have two years of service with a good payment history,



the loan process is simple.

- 1) Choose a contractor (must be licensed for heat pump installation)
- 2) Obtain cost estimates
- 3) Complete an application at any BEMC office or at bemc.org/weatherization-loans

he Are You OK? program is a computer system that is setup to call subscribers, at times of their choosing, every day to check if they are OK. Typically, this system is used to check on elderly family members or the disabled. When the system dials a subscriber's number and the subscriber answers the phone call, the system plays a message for them and logs the call as answered. If the subscriber does not answer

# Oak Island Receives \$579,500 for Project to Reduce Flooding Issues on Ocean Drive

n Tuesday, April 9, 2024 during the regular meeting of the Oak Island Town Council, Town Manager David Kelly reported that the Golden LEAF Foundation had awarded a \$579,500 grant to the Town for engineering and construction in the Dune Infiltration System Project. This grant is part of \$8 million in funding announced during the April meeting of the Golden LEAF Foundation Board of Directors on April 4. The funding was awarded for scholarships for rural students to attend North Carolina community colleges, the Food Distribution Assistance Program, and the Flood Mitigation Grant Program; through which Oak Island was awarded the \$579,500.

Started in August 2023, the soon completed project saw the installation of a "dune infiltration" style drainage system in the area of Ocean Drive. This system is already working to reduce ponding and decrease occurrences of standing water along Ocean Drive, following significant rain events. This is similar to a system which has proven very successful in neighboring Caswell Beach. Additionally, due to its installation under the dunes themselves, the system has increased the width of the area's secondary dunes, providing additional protection to infrastructure.

The State of North Carolina ap-

propriated \$25 million to the Golden LEAF Foundation to establish the Flood Mitigation Grant Program. The Flood Mitigation Grant Program provides up to \$2,000,000 per project from Golden LEAF to local governments for use on projects that address frequent flooding that impacts residents and businesses in a community. At their April 4 meeting, the Golden LEAF Board awarded \$5,531,456 in funding through the program to eight projects in Ashe, Avery, Brunswick, Craven, Dare, Duplin, Pasquotank, and Perquimans counties.

"The Golden LEAF Foundation was entrusted by the N.C. General Assembly to implement a program for local governments seeking to mitigate flooding in their community," said Golden LEAF President, Chief Executive Officer Scott T. Hamilton. "We are pleased to support the Town of Oak Island's engineering and construction to install a dune infiltration system along with a small pump station and reinforced concrete pipe to reduce flooding in the affected area."

The Town of Oak Island is excited to share this announcement of funding from Golden LEAF, which will help greatly offset the cost of a project so vital to the residents, property owners, and businesses along Ocean Drive.





# **Brunswick County Real Estate** Market Sees Jump In New Listings, **Strong Luxury Market During March**

tate market began its typical seasonal warm-up in March, with new listings increasing by more than a quarter compared to last March and a strong luxury market pushing the average sales price to almost \$500,000.

"Our market typically starts heating up in March, but last month was one for the books," said Cynthia Walsh, CEO of the Brunswick County Association of REAL-TORS® (BCAR). "March brought higher prices, driven in part by an extremely strong luxury market, and more homes coming onto the market. Homes are spending slightly fewer days on the market than last year, which indicates that demand remains strong. Overall, our market is strong as ever, and I see no indications of a slowdown in the coming months."

New listings increased 27.9% this March, from 610 to 780. Total sales volume increased 5% compared to March 2023, from \$240,610,000 to \$252,670,000. The number of homes sold decreased 3.8%, from 527 to 507. Homes spent an average of 70 days on the market, decreasing by five days compared to last year. The absorption rate is hovering around 3 months; below five months is generally considered a seller's market.

The average sales price increased 9.2%, from \$456,567 to \$498,365, while the median sales price increased 2.2%, from \$365,000 to \$372,990. These increases were likely fueled by last month's strong luxury market, with a total of 38 sales

runswick County's real es- over \$1 million. Of the 38 luxury sales, there were 12 in Ocean Isle Beach, 10 in Oak Island, 10 in Holden Beach, five in Bald Head Island and one in Southport. The two highest sales include a \$6 million sale on Bald Head Island and a \$4.5 million sale on Holden Beach.

> Year-to-date sales volume through March totaled \$561,530,000, up 10% from \$510,460,000 at the same point in 2023. The average year-todate sales price increased 10.7% compared to the same point in 2023, from \$430,939 to \$477,169, while the median sales price increased 2.4%, from \$363,527 to \$372,316. The number of units sold through March is up 2.1% compared to last year, from 1,145 to 1,169 and the number of new listings increased 26%, from 1,625 to 2,048.



# **Did You Know?**

ere you aware that hardwood trees above 15" DBH are protected on Oak Island effective March 15, 2024?

If not, it is probably because Town Staff has done nothing to publicize it. Tree Peace OKI is offering this information as a Public Service Announcement. We support the ordinances changes for the protection of our tree canopy. We want to save trees, we do not want a single homeowner to pay a fine for lack of knowledge of the ordinance.

A recent survey shows that Oak Island lost 197 acres of tree canopy

from 2014 to 2022.

Trees slow and redirect the wind and save our roofs. One mature oak tree can wick away 100 gallons of stormwater in a day – on an island without storm drains. Tree roots retain the sandy soil from wind and water driven erosion. Trees are a habitat for the birds that eat mosquitoes and flies. Trees reduce air conditioning loads. The very existence of this barrier island is dependent on preserving and restoring the tree canopy.

Trees improve property values.




Oak Island Uniform Development Ordinance Changes / Heritage Tree Protections

ON AN ISLAND NAMED FOR A TREE

- A permit is required to remove a Heritage Tree from <u>ANY</u> property effective March 15, 2024
- A Heritage Tree is defined as a hardwood tree with 15" DBH or a softwood tree with a 30" DBH
- DBH is Diameter at Breast Height [4 ½ feet above the ground] calculated as
  the tree circumference divided by pi [3.14]. A Hardwood Tree with a
  circumference 47" or greater measured 4 ½ feet above the ground is a
  Heritage Tree. A Softwood Tree with a diameter 94" or greater is a Heritage
  Tree
- · Violators are subject to a fine of \$500
- Contact the Town of Oak Island Department of Stormwater Management for a permit

Diamondback terrapins live in the

brackish water of salt marshes, estuaries, and tidal creeks. They feed on fish, marine snails, crabs, marine and tidal mollusks, carrion, clams, and worms. Life History: Adult terrapins nest on sandy borders of coastal salt marshes or in dunes.

Yellow Bellied Sliders are native to southeastern United States, specifically from Florida and parts of Virginia. HABITAT They live in freshwater or brackish (a mix of fresh and salt water) water. DIET As adults, they are omnivorous, and eat more plants. Juveniles will eat invertebrates.

Sea turtles live in almost every ocean basin throughout the world, nesting on tropical and subtropical beaches. They migrate long distances to feed, often crossing entire oceans.



# **Beach Rules for Our 4-Legged Friends**



ur canine friends love to romp and play on the beach. Each beach community has its own policy for dogs on the beach. Please remember to clean up behind your pet and fill in any holes they may dig.

#### **Caswell Beach**

Every dog within the town shall be leashed when not inside of the owner's residence or property or a closed vehicle. Dogs not leashed, but under control of its owner, are permitted on the beach strand between the hours of dawn and 9:00am; additionally from October 15 through March 15, dogs not leashed, but under control of its owner, are permitted on the beach strand.

#### **Holden Beach**

Pets are not allowed on the beach from May 20 to September 10, except between 5:00pm and 9:00am-daily. Pets must be on a leash at all times on the island.

#### **Oak Island**

Properly leashed dogs are allowed on the beach at any time, and are allowed off their leashes on the beach seasonally from October 15 - March 15, and under certain conditions. Owners must pick up after their dogs, and properly dispose of all droppings.

During seasonal periods where leashes are required, dogs MUST remain on their leash in ALL public beach areas. They may not be taken off-leash to enter the surf / water.

#### Ocean Isle

All dogs must be on a leash, contained or fenced at all times. No dogs allowed on the beach strand from 9:00am to 6:00pm from Memorial Day through Labor Day. No dogs allowed at any time in Public Access/Parking Areas. Pooper Scooper Ordinance is in effect island-wide.



## **Sunset Beach**


It shall be unlawful for an owner or another person to permit his/her dog to be on the beach strand between the hours of 9am and 6 pm from the Friday immediately preceding Memorial Day through Labor Day, whether or not the dog is leashed and under the control of the owner or some other person.

After 6:00pm and before 9:00am from the Friday immediately preceding Memorial Day through Labor Day, dogs are permitted on the strand if leashed and under the control of the owner or some other person assuming responsibility for the owner.

After Labor Day and before the Friday immediately preceding Memorial Day, dogs are permitted on the strand if leashed and under the control of the owner or some other person assuming responsibility for the owner.

# **Brunswick Islands Birding**



ight sites along the North Carolina Birding Trail are located in the Brunswick Islands. The Brunswick Islands' location along the coast of Southeastern North Carolina and its varied ecosystems make it a natural haven for hundreds of species of birds. 350 bird species have been spotted in Brunswick County. Listed below are the NC Birding Trail sites located in the county and the species of special interest specific to each one.

Please note that many shore birds nest in the sand on the beach. They tend to blend in so they can be hard to see, especially the babies. Nesting season runs from April through August, so when visiting the beach be sure to use only designated beach accesses through the dunes and avoid marked nesting areas.



he Civil War, which ended in the spring of 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in US history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries.

By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers.

It is unclear where exactly this tradition originated; numerous different communities may have independently initiated the memorial gatherings. And some records show that one of the earliest Memorial Day commemorations was organized by a group of formerly enslaved people in Charleston, South Carolina less than a month after the Confederacy surrendered in 1865. Nevertheless, in 1966 the federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day.

Waterloo - which first celebrated the day on May 5, 1866 – was chosen because it hosted an annual, community-wide event, during which businesses closed and residents decorated the graves of soldiers with flowers and flags.

#### **Decoration Day**

On May 5, 1868, General John A. Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance later that month. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed.

The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Civil War soldiers buried there.

Many Northern states held similar commemorative events and reprised the tradition in subsequent years; by 1890 each one had made Decoration Day an official state holiday. Southern states, on the other hand, continued to honor the dead on separate days until after World War I.

#### **Memorial Day**

Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars, including World War II, The Vietnam War, The Korean War and the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30, the date General Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.

Memorial Day itself-unofficially marks the beginning of summer.





- all operators must possess a valid driver's license

The vehicle must be registered with the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles and have a:

- valid license tag
- vehicle inspection
- and valid vehicle insurance

LSEV's fall under the following Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard. No. 500 (49 CFR 571.500) which

• they must have the ability to travel between 20-25 mph

- be equipped with headlamps
- be equipped stop lamps
- be equipped turn signal lamps
- be equipped tail lamps
- be equipped reflex reflectors
- be equipped parking brakes
- be equipped rearview mirrors
- be equipped windshields
- be equipped seat belts
- be equipped vehicle identification numbers (VIN)

If you are bringing a Low Speed Electric Vehicle (Golf Cart) from out of state your LSEV must be registered with your state of residence Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). have a license tag (hard tag just like your car) issued by your DMV and must have valid insurance


