Long emphasized this by noting that "in a small town like Utica, policing is more than just enforcing laws. It's about serving our residents in every way we can—from delivering meals during COVID to helping residents with everyday needs. Randy understands that here in Utica, our police are a part of the neighborhood."

As Utica continues to grow, the new leadership team remains committed to modernizing the department while honoring Utica's unique character. "Randy is bringing us into the 21st century. His knowledge of the latest state and county systems ensures Utica will have the best possible police protection," said Long.
