Call to Order

Committee Reports

<u>Public Safety Committee-</u> Members of the ONSE's office Mr. Alfred Duncan and Ms. Setareh Yelle provided an overview of the work their Office is currently doing. Violence Intervention program working community engagement, based on developing relationships. There is also a crime reduction initiative, that's a grant the ONSE's office received that brings together local partners, including government and community stakeholders to analyze mitigating factors that trap crime strategies that reduce crime. The ONSE's office is dedicated to work with individuals and communities to aid to reduce the violence.

<u>Economic Development</u>: Report given by secretary Tiera Fletcher. Currently the Economic Development Committee is:

Mr. Felder provided an overview of the Fletcher Johnson Site, regarding the community and the District's vision and the history of progression.

April 20th 2020 is when the District receive response from different development teams that are interested in redeveloping the site. DMPED is currently in the process of reviewing the proposals and reaching out to the different developers for additional questions to get clarity om different subject matters. Following the responses from the developers, the District will make an award, meaning they will select a development team to transform the site. In the interim, Mr. Felder has been engaging with members of the Fletcher Johnson Task Force as well as the ANC 7E Economic Development Committee to keep the community abreast of outgoings. Once an award is given, the community will be notified and be kept engaged.
