

Dear First Baptist Church Family,

Throughout my ministry over the years, I have encouraged the churches I have served to read, study, and meditate on God's word on a daily basis. It is helpful to have a reading plan. But beyond simply reading our Bibles we must study what a given passage means. Good study Bibles are helpful aids in understanding. Ultimately though, it is the Holy Spirit who will give us understanding of scripture as we meditate on various passages.

Before You Read and Study God's Word

Step One—Find a quiet place.

Step Two—Confess all known sin and ask the Lord for forgiveness.

Step Three—Pray for wisdom, understanding, and knowledge of God's word.

As You Study God's Word

Following are some "General Principles of Interpretation" from chapter 2 of Walter A. Henrichsen's book, *A Layman's Guide to Interpreting the Bible*.

Rule One—Work from the assumption that the Bible is authoritative.

Rule Two—The Bible interprets itself; scripture best explains scripture.

Rule Three—Saving faith and the Holy Spirit are necessary for us to understand and properly interpret the scriptures.

Rule Four—Interpret personal experience in the light of scripture and not scripture in light of personal experience.

Rule Five—Biblical examples are authoritative only when supported by a command.

Rule Six—The primary purpose of the Bible is to change our lives, not increase our knowledge.

Rule Seven—Each Christian has the right and responsibility to investigate and interpret the word of God for oneself.

Rule Eight—Church history is important but not decisive in the interpretation of scripture.


Rule Nine—The promises of God throughout the Bible are available to the Holy Spirit for the believers of every generation.

After You Study God's Word

You may want to write notes to remind yourself of what you learned, and how to apply it. A notebook can be helpful. Or you may want to write important insights and action points in the margin of your Bible. So much more can be said about the topic of studying the Bible, but I hope this helps you in your desire to know the Lord and his word better.
