DEI: How We Spent Our Summer Vacation

Summer saw the AAUW DEI Discussion Group join with the DEI Groups from DKG and OLLI to discuss topics that were of interest to all three groups. The meetings on Zoom focused on Banned Books (including: My Shadow is Purple, The Grapes of Wrath, Beloved, I am Jazz and Catcher in the Rye) Transgender Issues, Drag, and Juneteenth. We also spent time during each meeting discussing current events/issues that had a DEI Focus (AP African American Studies, Women's Issues, Don't Say Gay, Changes in TV Commercials, Privilege and more).

Starting in September, each group will go back to its own DEI Discussion Groups, although, it is hoped that the new friendships that were developed will lead to more interactions between the three groups.

OLLI is hosting three special events this fall that should be of interest to members of AAUW. On September 11th, VP of DEI at Pacific will speak on "Identity, Ageism and Ableism: Learners and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion." On October 9th, the Manager of the SJ County Pride Center will speak on Cultural and Diversity Awareness Supporting the LGBT+ Community. The third lecture in the series is presented by two members of Pacific's Benerd College's faculty on November 13th when they will discuss The Status of the Education System in Our Current Society. All three lectures will be in the Janet Leigh Theater on Mondays from 3:30-5:00. They are free and open to the public. The Public Policy Program advances equity for women and girls and is consistent with our values of achieving fair and equitable opportunities for our diverse society. After each "Policy Pillar" there is at least one point that you can grab onto & focus on this month:

• Economic Security for All Women

 Pay inequality not only hurts women now, it hurts them in retirement. "Moms' Equal Pay Day" is August 15. Moms working full-time, year-round are paid 74 cents and all earners (adding in part-time and seasonal) are paid 62 cents for every dollar paid to dads.

• Social and Racial Justice for All Members of Society

- Self-determination in reproductive health
- Freedom from violence in all its forms and wherever it occurs, including violence against historically marginalized groups, and support for policies that reduce or prevent gun violence.

• Equal Access to Quality Public Education for All Students

- Removal of barriers for girls to access instruction in STEM fields
- Access to diverse staff and curriculum that represents historically accurate information
- We all know book banning & censorship of educational materials are rapidly sweeping across the country. History is being rewritten and now, they are on our doorstep! But we don't have to tolerate it. More on that in a moment.

THANK YOU! Since 1978, AAUW-Stockton has managed the local RIF program, the largest children's literacy nonprofit in the U.S. With money from Community Outreach Funds and donations from individuals, the RIF Committee buys and distributes twice yearly about 1,000 books for the TK-6 students at three Stockton Unified elementary schools and the small County-run school for unhoused youngsters.
