Jordan Jinosko is the composer of Fort Dodge Choral Society's commission, Requiem Brevis, in memory of Bruce Perry. She is a multi-award winning American composer. Her music draws inspiration from history, mythology, nature, and her experience as a multiracial. transgender woman. Often, Jordan's music advocates for social causes.



Jordan was the winner of the Brazosport Symphony Orchestra

Composition Competition, the Green Dot Composers Competition, the Molly Mulligan Artistic Scholarship, the John A. Wollaver Award, and the After Life Film Festival's Best Film Score Award. She has composed scores for awardwinning films.

Jordan's music has been performed in concert halls across the United States and Canada, and has been featured on the radio, on streaming platforms, and at classical music conventions. She studied music composition and music theory at the University of Michigan and the Eastman Community Music School, and attended symposia with faculty at Juilliard, Princeton, Eastman, and Yale.
