Someone started digging a shallow grave for Kimmie Weeks when he was 10 years old. He had been suffering from cholera, which hit after chickenpox and before yellow jaundice. He was emaciated and dehydrated but saw no doctor, no nurse. This was war, after all-civil war in Liberia.

When they could no longer find a pulse in his chest, an older refugee decided Kimmie was dead. He told someone to wrap him up, and young men tossed him on a garbage pile where all the refugees' bodies went. The rest of Kimmie's life could have been erased had his mother not returned and run out, searching through the decaying bodies and shaking him back to life. This formative experience at such a young age led Kimmie to dedicate the rest of his life to working for change.

Four years later, he co-founded Voice of the Future Inc., and went to establish the Children's Bureau of Information. These grassroots organizations fought for freedom for Liberia's children. In 1996, as a young teen, he launched the Children's Disarmament Campaign, mobilizing thousands of children his age to advocate In 1998, he released a groundbreaking report on the Liberian government's involvement in the training of child soldiers. Several government attempts were made to assassinate him. Aided by a foreign government and traveling as a traditional dancer in a dance troupe to evade state security forces, Kimmie fled Liberia and was later granted political asylum in the United States.

Arriving in the US and still eager to make a difference in the lives of children and young people in Africa, he established Youth Action International. Since its establishment, Youth Action International's programs have benefited over 500,000 people in six postwar African countries.

Kimmie has been featured on major international news networks and in books and publications, including Peace in Our Lifetime alongsideNelson Mandela, Gandhi, and Martin Luther King, Jr.

He received a masters from the University of Pennsylvania and an honorary doctorate degree from Amherst College. He currently serves as Executive Director of Youth Action International. and as Senior Director of Africa for Integrum Scientific, and has embraced regenerative agriculture as a strategy to bring prosperity and peace.

With 95% of high school students in Liberia and Sierra Leone not being able to turn on a computer, let alone utilize it, YAI's goal is to put a computer training lab in every high school in both countries within five years. Each lab includes computers, internet access and solar power. Labs benefit students during school hours as well as young people in the community after school hours.
