Program

Cindi Williamson

- Square quilt, corners are 90 degrees
- Sew edges of quilt with either a serger, zig zag or straight stitch
- Cut 1 1/8 wide binding strips and press in half lengthwise
- Mark quilt corners with 1/4"/90-degree box
- Place the binding on the first edge of a quilt in the front and open. Allow one to two inches to extend beyond the quilt edge

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- Starting at the intersection of the box lines (hereafter referred to as THE DOT) stay stitch then sew the binding until the next dot a ¼ inch seam. Stop at the net dot and stay stitch.
- Repeat with each piece of binding
- Fold the quilt at the corner to make a triangle aligning the two binding strips
- Mark and sew a 45 degree line from the DOT to the center of the binding (stay stitch at each end. Sew a 90 degree line f rom the center to ¼" from the other edge of the binding
- Repeat for all corners
- Flip the binding to the back ad fold under the ¼" and hand sew down.

Mary Bucy: Facing as Binding,

Perfect for modern quilts or quilts that go to the edge without a border.

Cut strips of binding 2 1/4" or 2 1/2" wide. Join pieces with a 45 degree seam if needed. Press lengthwise in half. Also cut 4 squares of the binding fabric 3 to 3 1/2" and press in half along the diagonal.

On the right side of the quilt, pin a folded square in each corner with the raw edges aligned with the corners of the quilt. Then pin a folded strip to each side overlapping with the corner triangles, raw edges to the outside. Sew around the outside of the quilt and trim corners. Press the strips out away from the

quilt. Stay stitch the strip near the seam around the quilt, skipping past the corners.

Pin or clip the strip to the back and flip the corners over to the back. Hand stitch the binding and corners to the back of the quilt.

Lisa Echerd: Sleeves

Lisa showed 3 ways to create hanging sleeves for your quilts.

Method 1 creates corners and requires no hand sewing. This method is suitable for smaller quilts and is particularly useful if you want to hang a quilt that can be turned different ways.

Method 2 is the way she creates hanging sleeves for most of my quilts. She demonstrated how to create the sleeve by attach before the binding goes on. She also shared the type of hangers used to put quilts on the wall.

Method 3 is from the American Quilt Society She demonstrated how to create a hanging sleeve that is attached to the finished quilt. The advantages of this method are that the sleeve can be removed if you no longer want to hang the quilt and it may be suitable for shows that require a sleeve. The disadvantage is more hand sewing. She gave out a one page handout that gives the steps for each method.

Catherine Caswell: Flange Binding

Cut Flange at 1 ½" and Binding at 1 ¼" which makes 1/8" flange. These measurements may be changed. The finished flange will be ½ the difference between the two widths.

Use ¼" seams except where noted. Sew all the binding strips together and all the flange strips

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together. Sew the long strips to each other avoiding matching the diagonal seams. Press seams towards binding (smaller of the strips.) Fold in half lengthwise and press.

Sew to the BACK of the quilt, right sides together. (backside of the quilt to the side of the binding that only shows a little of the flange.) Miter the corners as you would for regular binding.

Roll binding section to the front of the quilt. (I like to press open then over to the front.)

Stitch in the ditch using thread that matches the binding or clear thread for the upper thread and bobbin.
