Every booth put out their best. We had the Learning Center who taught children and an adult, the Hospitality Committee that made sure the vendors were happy and that we had a white glove detail to assist our visitors. The scavenger hunts were mentioned frequently and thoroughly enjoyed, and helped visitors really observe our quilts. Our Community Committee show cased our Guild beautifully, and all the ways we contribute to the area. Fat Quarter Raffle Baskets had 19 baskets, and each had yardage in them thanks to donations from our members. Lily Boutique was constantly busy with customers and had such a variety of items for sale. Again, this is a tribute to our talented members. Admissions processed visitors quickly and adapted to our new technology, the square reader. Our raffle quilt sales did a booming business along with the Silent Auction.
