First Lutheran Church Preschool 2024—2025Tuition Policy

Upon enrolling your child in First Lutheran Church Preschool, please be certain that you understand and agree to the following tuition policies:

- Please make all checks to FLC Preschool.
- A non-refundable fee of \$125.00 is required upon enrollment.
- Tuition is due the first day of each month September through May. Cash or checks may be given directly to the teacher or mailed to the office.
 - 2 Day Class-\$185 a month/\$1,665 per school year
 - 3 Day Class-\$265 a month/\$2,385 per school year
 - 4 Day Class—\$335 a month/\$3,015 per school year
- Any tuition not received by the 10th of the month will be assessed a \$25.00 late charge.
- A 30 day delinquency shall constitute grounds for dropping the child from class pending review.
- A charge of \$25 for all non-sufficient funds (NSF) checks.
- The monthly tuition is an average of all the school days for the entire nine months, September-May. It takes into consideration school holidays, one school in-service day, school closures due to inclement weather, emergencies, and start and finish dates.
- Scholarships are available on need based assessment.
 Scholarship forms may be obtained from the Preschool Director.
- 10% multiple child discount on oldest child's tuition.
- 10% discount for FLC members
- Preschool Board Members receive a discount of 5% for first year, 10% for second year and 15% discount for third year of continued service (no more than 15% will be discounted).
- Only one discount will be applied per student.

Absences or Withdrawal from the program:

- Tuition must be paid even if your child is absent from class for an extended period of time due to illness or vacations.
- If your child has to drop from the preschool, you must give two weeks written notice to the Preschool Director.

<u>Procedures of Daily Arrival:</u> Please arrange arrival time to be no earlier than five minutes before the class begins. Please take your child to the bathroom and wash their hands before school begins. This cuts down on sickness in our class. An adult must walk the child into the building and stay with him/her until the preschool door is opened for class.

<u>Please do not park in the handicap spaces:</u> We have many meetings and activities going on during the week and we need to save those spots for the people with handicaps or the elderly.

<u>Daily Dismissal:</u> The children will only be released to their parent or an authorized adult. If another adult is picking up your child, please be sure to tell the teacher and send a note with their name, your child's name, the date and your signature.

<u>Immunization forms:</u> We must have a completed immunization form and emergency card filled out with local numbers by conference time. Your child cannot start school without these completed forms.

<u>Health:</u> Your child will be sent home if he/she appears to have symptoms of illness during school. In such cases a parent or guardian will be called to pick the child up. Please keep your child home if he/she has had a fever or diarrhea or is vomiting in the previous 24 hours. Due to school policy we cannot administer any type of shots or medication.

<u>Snow Days:</u> We will be closing with the Northshore school closures. If for any reason, we decide differently, you will be notified via facebook and email. We will make up days if more than two are missed.

<u>Snacks:</u> You will be responsible for bringing a snack for the entire class on a rotating basis. The snack schedule will be posted monthly outside the door on the bulletin board and online. All snacks shall be store bought and unopened. You are also responsible for napkins, cups, and spoons if needed for the snack. A half gallon of milk or juice and a package of 5oz. Waxed Dixie cups are great for drinks. Please avoid Capri Sun and other sugary drinks. Do not bring Styrofoam cups. Please check out our snack suggestion list on page 10 for ideas. Please special snacks such as cupcakes for birthdays only.

<u>Allergies:</u> Due to allergies, no nut, peanut or peanut products are allowed. If your child has a significant food allergy, we ask that you send their own safe snack daily.

<u>Birthdays:</u> We will be celebrating your child's birthday on the snack day closest to the date. If you are passing out invitations at school, please be sure to include everyone. If you choose not to include everyone, please mail them to avoid hurt feelings. Special snacks such as pudding cups, ice cream, store bought cupcakes, etc. will be allowed that day.

<u>Clothing:</u> The best clothes for preschoolers are comfortable, washable, play clothes. Please do not send them in clothes that cannot get messy! Please be sure that they can get their clothes on and off to go to the bathroom without help. Please send your child in comfortable shoes. Please no Heelys, flip flops, high heels, or bulky boots that are uncomfortable at circle time. Shoes must be worn at all times in our classroom.

<u>Show and Tell:</u> Children bring show and tell on their snack day only. Please limit show and tell items to one or two. No weapons or toys that promote violence will be shown.
