





# First Capital Garden

A Semiquincentennial Celebration of Philadelphia's Past & Future as a World Heritage Garden City

The First Capital Garden is a \$10 million project to memorialize Philadelphia's 250- year history as a world heritage garden city and to celebrate its evolving future

The project is conceived as a global partnership involving China, Hong Kong and Taiwan and is designed as a historical complement to the \$100 million China National Garden opening in the U.S. National Arboretum in Washington DC in late 2019

The project highlights three distinct stages in Philadelphia's history:

## 1776

**Features:** A Lenni Lenape longhouse and garden featuring traditional crops from heirloom Lenape seeds
A Quaker farmhouse and garden featuring period flowers and crops from heirloom Quaker seeds
A Chinese pavilion and garden featuring tea and exotic botanical imports prized in the colonies

Educational Focus: Lifestyle & ecological sustainability of the Lenape native inhabitants

William Penn and Philadelphia's cultural exchange with the Lenape & China Establishment of the nation's first arboretums with plants from China Ben Franklin's deep well of inspiration drawn directly from China

## 1876

Features: Google Arts & Culture digital recreation of the Chinese Pavilion at the Centennial World's Fair

Permanent exhibition of artifacts from the Chinese Pavilion

Educational Focus: The history of the first World's Fair to be held in the United States of America

Direct experience of the most popular exhibitions from the Centennial

## The Next 100 Years

**Feature:** A program of international collaboration and academic exchange, based on the founding

collaboration with China, Hong Kong and Taiwan but open to all international partners, to keep

Philadelphia at the forefront of the digital cultural heritage preservation field globally
