Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Meeting Date: Sept 17, 2020

Attendees: Jim Cook, Bill Bohlen, Chad Whisenant, Roger Sherman

- 1. Jim called the meeting to order at 6:35pm, and informed that the Bylaws state that a "quorum" is considered a majority of the board. Since 4 of 6 board members were present, a quorum was reached.
- 2. Minutes from previous board meeting (June 20, 2020) were approved unanimously.
- 3. Dan Nelson was asked to remove his business related yard sign and he removed it on 9/17/20.
- 4. Jim discussed that signs are not allowed per our Covenants. However, political yard signs for candidates and/or ballot issues must be allowed per state statute within a certain time period around election dates. Other yard signs, such as signs saying "In this house we believe...", may probably be disallowed.
- 5. Jim talked about sending another newsletter before the end of the year. Topics for the newsletter may include:
 - a. Yard signs
 - b. Fall Workday / Planting Day
 - c. Yard upkeep and maintenance
 - d. Parking in driveways vs. on street
- 6. HOA finances look good, but tree work/cleanup cost exceeded the budgeted amount. With mature trees the board should consider increasing the annual budget for tree management and cleanup.
- 7. Spruce tree in greenbelt east of 5268 Wheaton is scheduled to be removed on October 26, 2020.
- 8. The HOA will request proposals from contractors for 2021 irrigation management.
- 9. Lindgren will winterize/blowout the irrigation system in October. The City is mandating that irrigation end by October 1 this year.
- 10. Jim presented DRAFT driveway and shed policies. He would like the board to review the policies so they can be approved during the next meeting.
- 11. Water allotment cost Roger volunteered to contact the city to determine the current cost of water.
 - a. Follow up \$6900.00 purchase would increase Oakridge Village 2's allotment by 54,466 gallons. This translates to 12.67 cents per gallon.
 - b. There is a proposed 3% increase for 2021. We will know more in November after City Council review. This would roughly put the cost at 13.05 cents per gallon.
- 12. Chad proposed that a yard maintenance policy is needed. The new policy should address mowing, weeding, yard ornaments, watering, trash/debris, pruning, maintenance of area outside of their fence but on their lot. Chad will research other community policies.
- 13. Bill initiated a discussion regarding on-street parking what are City requirements for parking on residential local streets? Need to evaluate parking restrictions.
- 14. Chad ask the board to consider a policy that would not allow rentals in the community. This topic will require further discussion.
