“At least 11 Haitians were massacred by armed gangs in a rural town north of Port-au-Prince, the locality’s interim leader confirmed Thursday. “The situation is still very difficult for us,” Joseph Jeanson Guillaume, the town’s interim executive, told the Miami Herald. “The gangs are still here; we really need national and international assistance.” Guillaume first confirmed the massacre in a communique. He said that Tuesday night an armed group with “large guns” opened fire on the residents in Source-Matelas, which is part of Cabaret, the city just north of the capital. The incident occurred around 9 p.m.”
