Recommendations included: a new blade of the proper type i.e. use a crosscut blade for cross cut operations - stay away from combination type blades, check blade alignment with the table top miter slot, check fence alignment to blade-distance to the blade should be a few thousands wider at the exit side of the cut if using the fence. Actually using a stop block on the fence ahead of the blade is a better
