COMMUNITY UNITY IS THEME FOR FIFTH ANNUAL OLD HOME WEEK

by Catherine Calvert Alton's Fifth Annual Old Home Week is quite unique. It's a "ten day" week "old and it has nothing to do with homes"! But one thing is for sure. It's the going to be a heap of fun for all family and it has been a heap of work for this year's small central committee consisting of Sherman Brown, John boy, Ed Consentino, Judy Fry, and Archie and Judy Thibeault.

This year's big event begins on August 9 with the Police Association Penny Sale and concludes on August 18 with an Ecumenical Service at the Advent Christian Campground in Alton Bay. In between will be such popular repeat events as the Fire Department Barbeque, Woodsman's Field Day, Flower and Bicycle Decorating Contests for children, a Road Race, the Lions Pancake Breakfast, a big Parade, the famous Barbershoppers Jamboree, and much more.

At the Saturday night Block Party,

there will be lots of games, dancing, and good food sponsored by such organizations as the American Legion, Eastern Star, Knights of Columbus, Alton-New Durham Lions, and the Society of 40/8 Voiture No. 618. Two new events this year are an Antiques Appraisal Day at the Alton Historical Society Museum and a Windsurfing Regatta on Alton Bay.

ing Goods. Each year the logo chosen represents something from a different section of Alton. The East Alton Meeting House is this year's selection.

If the very significant theme is to have its intended meaning, "COMMUNITY UNITY" will mean that everybody will turn out from every nook and cranny of Alton for this very special celebration of the 1985 Old Home Week.

\$100 BUDGET IN 1892 TO 12,000 BOOKS NOW

In 1892, the town of Alton enjoyed its first public library. At the Annual Town Meeting, the town voted to accept a from gift of \$100 worth of books The State and also to appropriate \$50. Alton Free Public Library its opened over Laban doors on December 31, 1892, G. Welch's Drugstore, now Fern's Center on Main Street.

On June 9, 1894, the Library was moved to the newly-erected Town Hall, and was called The Library and Reading Room. A catalog of books was published for \$35 and copies were sold for 25 cents each. Catalogs were needed as patrons were not allowed behind the guard rail that protected the book cases!

The 1897 Town Report shows concern for care of books by the following: "A few books have been mutilated the past year, we think, by allowing small children to play with them at home. Permit us to call attention to the fact that the public owns its public library, that the best guardians, and the proper guardians, of the books and magazines in the library are the people who use them. that Will you Kindly assist us to see your property is not injured Ьν that the unusual who use it. We find privileges granted in this library individual very rarely abused. If each visitor will take that personal interest in the books here gathered which thev should take, in view of the fact that mutithey, in part are his or her own, lation and theft would be still uncommon than they are now."

In 1951, a new Library was constructed to be named the Gilman Library after Oliver J. M. Gilman, whose picture hangs in the Library over the north fireplace. His will, written October 14, 1914, states: "Ten thousand dollars shall be paid to the said town of Alton

as a fund the income of which shall be used for the purchase of land and erection of a public library building there-upon for said town."

However, that amount of money was not considered enough to build a new Library and the money was left at interest. In 1940, a building committee was appointed. The war intervened, and the building was not begun until 1950. Land was donated by Lewis P. Varney in memory of his son, Robert Wilson Varney, and construction was begun under the direction of Roy C. Barnes.


The building was finished in 1951, and the dedication ceremony was held November 9, 1951. Annie Wheeler, the librarian, was associated with the Library since 1896 and was the librarian from 1909 to 1958.

In 1979, the basement meeting room was completed and dedicated to Agnes Thompson. Also in 1979, the Friends of the Library was formed under the leader-ship of Martha Headley.

The Library is growing. Gifts from generous and thoughtful townspeople continue; weekly hours have increased from 6 to 20; the budget has grown from \$50 to \$15,038; book collection from \$100 worth of books to 12,011 volumes; and staff from volunteer status to a librarian and an assistant.

ing's Landing. In 1951 almost the entire Norwich Chapter came to Alton Bay. Again with the help of the Aberjona Moaners they presented about an hour and a half eight show. The fourth year there were quartets from three chapters participating. That year the net proceeds of the show amounted to \$1,001 which was donated to Huggins Hospital. Until 1956 the concerts were held at Downing's Landing. After that the concerts were moved the new Alton School and have been held there ever since.

In 1963 Bill Marsden, who had been the director for 13 years, died in early summer and the proceeds from the Jamboree that year were donated to Huggins Hospital in his memory.

In 1975 after hosting the Jamboree for 25 years the Norwich Chapter felt they could no longer do so. The Nashua, N. H., Chapter took over as Host Chapter and set up a scholarship trust fund in Chapter. the name of the Norwich year a scholarship is awarded to a dent who has successfully completed one year of college.
