


Suitcase Journal:


- Fold a 9x12 piece of brown construction paper in half.
- Copy the suitcase handles and corners onto green paper (The handles will last longer if they are laminated. Copy the suitcase tags onto different colored paper. Cut the straps out of red paper.
- Attach the handles to the inside of the folder opening.
- Decorate with the other journal pieces.
- Staple the pages inside the journal. Save pages by copying front to back.






Grocery Bag Suitcase Pieces




Directions:

- -Add a ribbon to hang the ornament.














Germany Activity: Christmas Pickle






Directions:

Even though this isn't a "craft" it is one of my children's FAVORITE things during Holidays around the World. I have them take off their shoes and place them in the hall. I usually have another teacher or parent sneak by and place treats in their shoes. They are so excited when they go get their shoes that have goodies inside! If you would prefer not to have students remove their shoes, I am including a blackline of a shoe that can be copied on brown, glued or stapled together and filled with a small treat.

Copy on brown paper. Have students cut all the way around the shoe and fold at the bottom. Glue it together leaving the top of the shoe open.








- -Cut toilet paper rolls in half or paper towel rolls into thirds.



Students can cut the strips on the line and then staple the lantern into a circle.





