



IT'S STORY TIME IN SPRING HILL

Story time at the Spring Hill Library is always a big hit, although it might be a toss-up as to who enjoys it more, the kids or Marsha Gallardo, Children's Librarian and Head of Programming.

"I have a great passion for this," she says. "To see the light come on with these kids, it's like you're seeing a miracle before your eyes. It's always amazing."

Gallardo, who says research shows a child develops 50 percent of their intelligence by the age of four, works hard to find books that spark an interest, present the stories in a way that connects, and create an environment that sets kids up for success.

"I'm a big advocate for a developmentally appropriate learning environment, so having them feel like a confident risk taker and

decision-maker is one of the biggest things on my mind as I'm pulling things together," she explains. "I want to make them feel safe to express their ideas so they can make mistakes and see them as just a learning tool, to get a stronger sense of self."

To do that, she encourages children to respond.

"When I'm reading a story, I don't mind if they interrupt because I want their thoughts and I want a reaction. Sharing books is like an invitation to a conversation. And I have a way of incorporating it in, then moving on and keeping it flowing. The best way to build their brains is by responses. You want to get them talking and thinking outside the box."

Story time is not just about books either. Gallardo also includes songs and music.



"I'm not a great singer, and I'm not a great guitar player, but I do both every day. Singing songs is just another way to explore and play with the language."

She tries to make the songs interactive to encourage kids to use their imaginations.

"We do the song about 'I looked out my window and what did I find, but green leaves growing on my pumpkin vine.' Then I ask what else is growing on my pumpkin vine? And a kid might say something like dinosaurs or hotdogs, and they'll all laugh. And I'll work that into the song, and the child will look back at mom or dad as if to say, 'Look, she used my words!' It's so precious when they've taken a risk and landed safely."

She also has kids do an art project after the books and songs. "I'll set out rubber bands and paint or shaving cream and liquid watercolors and droppers because kids are inspired more by materials than the end product. It opens up all kinds of possibilities."

Gallardo says with every story time kids always leave with "something" even if they don't seem to participate.

"Sometimes, the kids who are the quietest ones in the room are the ones who hug me on the way out. Or I'll hear how they'll play story time at home and pretend they're Miss Marsha and read books to their teddy bears."

While she devotes a lot of energy to story time, she's also in charge of the multitude of programs available for all ages. Between July 2021 and July 2022, the library saw more than 20,000 people attend nearly 600 different programs.

"We try to vary the programs to bring people into the library," she says. "For example, last night we had Trivia Night, a magic show in the morning before that, and the day before, we had baby time, yoga, and a sign language class."

She says there's something for everyone, and everyone is welcome.

"People can stop in anytime, and our calendar of events is on our website ${\bf Springhill library.org.}$ "



NOT LIKE ANY OTHER CO-OP

It's been serving Maury County for years, although it changed its name a couple of years ago when it merged with other co-ops in Middle Tennessee. United Farm and Home Cooperative is a farm supply store and so much more.

"When you go in a lot of co-ops, they tend to be smaller buildings, and technically, they're just small farm stores," says Ryan Pilkinton, Location Manager. "But with this one, while we're a farm supply first, we also have clothes, boots, footwear, a home décor section, a huge pet section with a self-serve dog wash, and an automotive section, as well."

Co-ops are created to serve their members, but anyone can shop there. What this store does offer, especially for farmers, is not only an array of items but expertise, insight, and advice.

"I have very good employees who are very knowledgeable," Pilkinton says, "and we pride ourselves on customer service. Some of them have been working 30 plus years, so they've been around, done a little bit, and seen a little bit of everything. And a lot of them have animals themselves. So, if you have questions about a product, they can tell you how to use it, when you need to use it, how much you need to use, and they'll even tell you if you probably shouldn't use it right now."



Pilkinton grew up in Maury County and had a farming background. When it came time to pursue a career, he knew he wanted it to be farm related.

"I always wanted to do something in agriculture, so when I got out of high school, I started working for what was then Maury Farmers Co-op. I worked on the dock as a warehouse employee, loading feed and stuff like that, then I moved inside and did sales. And I continued working part-time when I started college."

He stayed with the Co-op, and in 2020, when they opened the new store, he was given the job as location manager. He's seen some changes through the years, including a merger that brought different co-ops together. The list included Maury, Humphreys, Dickson, Marshall, and Williamson Farmers Co-ops.

"As I mentioned earlier, we were Maury Farmer's Co-op, but in 2021 a group of us came together to make one co-op which is called United Farm and Home Co-op. And we now have 11 retail locations across Middle Tennessee." The move was designed to better serve co-op members.

"The bigger you are, the stronger you are," Pilkinton says.
"We're able to take advantage of buying power, obviously. If you're buying for one location, now you're buying for 11 locations, so you tend to get a little bit of a better deal, and we can pass that on to farmers. It's also made us stronger in terms of assets and equipment. We can share with each other."

United Farm and Home Co-op sponsors many local events and organizations, such as Mule Day, the county fair, and sports teams. It's a way to make sure some of the money spent locally stays local.

Pilkinton says he's proud of his store, the community it serves, and all it offers.

"If you've never been in our store, I would highly recommend it. I promise you, it's not what you're thinking when you hear coop. This is not like any other co-op."







Spiced Pork Ribs

TOTAL TIME: 3 HOURS, 10 MINUTES | 6 SERVINGS

INGREDIENTS:

2 RACKS (ABOUT 4 POUNDS) BABY BACK RIBS
1/4 CUP TAJÍN CLÁSÍCO SEASONING
1/4 CUP TAJÍN MILD HOT SAUCE, PLUS ADDITIONAL FOR SERVING, DIVIDED

2 TABLESPOONS OLIVE OIL
2 TABLESPOONS BROWN SUGAR
LIME WEDGES, FOR SERVING
MASHED POTATOES OR STEAMED RICE,
FOR SERVING (OPTIONAL)



DIRECTIONS:

Rub ribs with seasoning. Marinate at least 4 hours or overnight in refrigerator.

Preheat oven to 300 F. Combine hot sauce, oil and brown sugar; brush over both rib racks.

Line baking sheet with double layer of aluminum foil with enough overhang to wrap foil around ribs.

Lay ribs, bone side down, on foil-lined baking sheet. Wrap foil around ribs and seal. Place on baking sheet.

Fill large baking dish or roasting pan with 2 inches of boiling water. Place on lower oven rack to keep ribs moist as they bake. Place ribs on middle oven rack.

Bake 2 1/2-3 hours, or until meat is tender and just starting to fall off bone.

Preheat broiler. Unwrap ribs and place on foil-lined baking sheet. Broil 4-6 minutes on middle oven rack, or until lightly charred and caramelized.






