Runyan's Ramblings DUES INCREASE STARTING JULY 2024

At the National Convention in Charlotte, NC 2023, the organization voted and approved increasing the National dues

per capita. Currently, a portion of each member's dues goes to the National and State for supporting their programs and costs. Right now, your per capita is \$39.50, of which \$18 goes to National, and \$21.50 goes to the state.

This dues increase was determined by National leadership and the finance commission. The main reasoning for the dues increase: 1) The last dues increase was in 2016 2) Costs and inflation have gone way up over seven years 3) Cost of youth programs continue to increase.

When the dues increase was passed, it meant the national per capita would go from \$18 to \$23 per member, which is not debatable. However, the state leadership and finance committee did not want our Michigan members to bear the brunt of such a dues increase. Therefore, at last year's state convention, the state discontinued mailing every member a copy of the Legionnaire newspaper, saving nearly a quarter million dollars. With these savings, it was the intention that we could help members and post not have to pay the entire \$5 increase. There is a resolution that will be addressed at our state convention in July, stating that the state will reduce its per capita portion.

The National dues increase will take place in July. It is HIGHLY encouraged that every post take a good look at their current dues structure and decide if they also need to raise their dues. Remember, if the resolution passes at our state convention to SAVE members money, per capita will be \$42.50, and if it were to fail, per capita will be \$44.50

Its Latin name is Papaver Rhoeas. The four petals are vivid red, most commonly with a black spot at their base. In the northern hemisphere, it generally flowers in late spring. These plants are true annuals. Since poppies are self-sowing, if you allow them to go to seed, you may need to plant them only once.

Post must be familiar with the constitutions that guide our actions within The American Legion. The National Department allows each Post to organize and exist. Post leaders, it is your responsibility to ensure the posts you lead understand and follow these guidelines. I

ask myself when a post fails to follow these guidelines, is it really an American Legion post or just a loose group of veterans not following the will of our founders? I also wonder what type of organization there is within the Post. The following three paragraphs are taken straight from the Department Constitution, Article VII. I ask that you please read and follow the guidance.

Section 13: Any Post of the Department failing to meet the obligations imposed upon it by the National Constitution and By-Laws, or Department Constitution and By-Laws, or ceasing to function for six (6) months as an American Legion Post, or neglecting to pay the per capita dues to the National, Department and District organizations, shall, upon the order of the Department Executive Committee, surrender its charter, together with all property of every description including, but not limited to, all assets, both real and financial, and official insignia and records belonging to the Department

Section 16: The Department Executive Committee, after notice and hearing, may suspend or recommend for revocation, the charter of a Post which violates the National Constitution and By-Laws of The American Legion, or the Department Constitution and Bylaws or which fails adequately to discipline any of its members for any such violation, and may provide for the government and administration of such Post or the membership thereof, during such suspension or upon such revocation.

Section 17: All Posts of the Department must conduct, open, and close their local meetings as per the National "Officer's Guide and Manual of Ceremonies" or its' succeeding publication. The Department Judge Advocate shall not approve any Constitution and Bylaws of a Post unless the same shall provide that said Post must conduct, open, and close its local meetings as per National "Officer's Guide and Manual of Ceremonies" or its succeeding publication. Any Post failing to meet the above provision shall be subject to the discipline provided for in Section 13 of this Article and any other authorized discipline.

As we begin a new year, I ask you to consider embracing a new habit. Hopefully, many of you have incorporated this habit

into your weekly routine for some time now. Hebrews 10:24-25 "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another ..."

A great place to start is with your local high school for most Americanism Programs, Oratorical Contests and scholarships, Boys State and Boys Nation, Youth scholarships, and Junior Law Cadet Enforcement program (Student Trooper). Principals, Guidance Counselors, and Social Studies teachers can help you identify students interested in these programs. Contacting your school's district offices for information about School Board meetings is sometimes the best way to get excitement for the programs.

Starting a Legion Baseball team or collecting Educator of the Year candidates can also benefit from School Board, PTA, and Booster meetings. Remember, if you are trying to attract youths to a program, look for other organizations that help kids!

If your post sponsors a Scout troop, finding candidates for Eagle Scout of the Year and the Square Knot Award will be easy. If you do not currently host a Scout troop, the Michigan Crossroads Council of Scouting can help you. Boy Scouts are also a great resource for assembling an American Legion Shooting Sports Team.

Getting submissions for the other two programs, Law Officer and Firefighter of the Year, requires some leg work. Contact all departments in your area. For Law Enforcement, don't forget DNR.

You will want to have members willing to judge or evaluate candidates regardless of the program. You may decide to have your officers serve on your committee or allow all members to vote during a regular meeting. However, when you choose your finalist, make sure you forward all of their information to the department before the deadline so they can be considered for State and National recognition.
