More and more, as I travel across this great State, it is clear that Posts are becoming much more active in their communities. Activities such as veteran festivals, memorial dedications, participation in local events, and children's activities are all getting your Post into the limelight of your community, and local citizens and younger veterans are taking notice. Now, on to the meat of why we serve our fellow Veterans in this great organization, The American Legion. For the past year or so, we've heard about the "Be The One" initiative, and many have asked, "What is that all about?" In his powerful and moving acceptance speech, newly elected National Commander Daniel J. Seehafer put

it this way, "... with all this talk about numbers on this very subject, the only number I want us to push is 'one,' as in *Be the One to save one, yes, one veteran, or even their spouse, from taking his or her own life.*"

Veteran suicide is an epidemic that we must get a handle on. Just one Veteran's life is too many, so where do we start? One of the most basic steps we can take is to know our members, and there is no better way than to keep up with our Buddy Checks. Buddy Checks are NOT about membership, but more importantly, they're all about starting an open and comfortable dialogue between members of your Post. When we're not feeling quite the way we think we should about things, an open and caring voice may allow us to talk through to the heart of the issues. Just starting a conversation may be all it takes to give that Veteran or family member the time to think about things a little deeper. Let's all learn what to do when we run into those situations, and your Post Service Officer is a great starting point. Your Service Officer has a wealth of resources designed especially for these situations. Start the conversation, then get them the assistance and helping hand they are calling out for.

The national dues for the year 2025 are scheduled to increase, and this change is set to take effect on July 1st, 2024. This information suggests that members or organizations affected by these dues should be prepared for the higher fees starting from that date. It's advisable to discuss details on the specific changes and how they may impact you or your post.

The Department is not planning to increase your dues by the full \$5 initially proposed. Instead, they are considering a partial increase of \$2.50. To cover the remaining increase in dues, they plan to allocate funds from the newspaper portion of the dues. This decision appears to be a response to a prior decision by the National organization, which has led the Department to take this action earlier than originally expected.

This information suggests that while dues will increase, it won't be as substantial as initially anticipated due to the Department's efforts to mitigate the impact on members. It's essential to stay informed about the details of this proposed resolution and how it might affect your membership or participation in the organization.

Indeed, it's crucial to be well-informed about any potential changes in dues structures, especially if your post is considering an increase. Early discussions and planning can help members prepare for any financial adjustments and ensure transparency in the decision-making process. It's also an opportunity to gather input from members and assess the impact of the proposed changes on the organization's financial health and member satisfaction. Effective communication and collaboration during this process can lead to a smoother transition and better member understanding of the reasons behind the changes.

According to the National organization, starting this fall or close to the end of the year, members will be able to Renew their dues membership for multiple years. You can continue to

renew for only one year, but there is going to be an option to renew your dues for up to three years at once.

Why is this important? Yes, National is raising their dues! Your Post may be raising dues, too! So, if you ACT NOW, you can renew your dues at the current rate up to three (3) years. It was very hot in North Carolina. The newly elected national President is Lisa Williamson from Alaska. The National Vice President, Trisha Ward, is from the Department of Iowa, and Carol T. Robinson was selected as the Central Division Vice President, is from the Department of Ohio.

Fall Conference has come and gone. What fun we had with our theme, "Champions for our Veterans with PTSD." My special Project is the PTSD Foundation of America.

I hope everyone who came learned a lot and had fun. I want to thank all the chairpeople who presented their programs at the fall conference and our honorary Junior President for presenting her program, Guardian Angel Dogs. As she has stated many times, if we save one veteran's life, then it is worth the cost.

District Presidents and those who attended, please remember to share the information you received. Let's not keep it a secret. Our programs and our organization depend on communication. Please remember to promote the "Be the One" and the Veterans Hotline 998. With the uptick in veteran suicide, we must do our part to help prevent these from happening.

Did you know?

- 60% of veterans who die by suicide have not been seen by the VA in the past two years.
- Family members have a 35% greater risk for anxiety-related disorders
- Military suicides have risen to unprecedented levels
- Active-duty suicides rates increased in 2023 vs. the same time period in 2022
- 70% of suicide deaths are firearms-related, and 90-95% of those are successful
- All other methods are a mere 5% successful
- Reduced access to lethal methods decreases suicide rates
- About 90% of people who survive a suicide attempt do not die by suicide later
- 30% increase in suicide in the United States in the last 25 years
- Each death by suicide affects an estimated 135 individuals
- 70% of suicide deaths happen within one hour from first thought to action
- Building time between the impulse and the act to harm oneself can save a life

"IT'S OK TO SAY YOU'RE NOT OK!" BE THE ONE. Ask Veterans in your life how they are doing. Listen when a veteran needs to talk. Reach out when you think a veteran might be struggling.

These are some of the statistics we learned at the National Convention. We need to change how people feel about asking for help and Mental Health support. This starts with changing your attitude about suicide. Be the One to make a change, Be the one to reach out, Just Be the One. Sometimes, a phone call just to say, "Hey, how's it going?"

Now let's remember to also be the champions in membership before our deadlines. Sara, our new staff at the Department handling membership, is working diligently on all the transmittals and trying her best to keep on top of membership this year. Shyllynn Jones, our Department Membership Chairperson, hopes that we will be the Champion in membership at the end of the year. Although we ask each unit to gain at least one member (Champion Foals), don't stop there. You can Recruit ten members and receive a gift selected by the National Membership Chairperson. Let's not forget about signing up junior members. (Pretty Ponies)

Remember to "Be The One" for our veterans. Check out the guides on our Department Page. I hope to see Michigan in the Winners Circle this year as we race to be the Champion for our Veterans.

Constitution and Bylaws

The Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules are necessary to maintain the efficiency and effectiveness of your Unit operations. In Michigan, each Unit is required to accept the Uniform Unit Constitution and Uniform Unit Bylaws. The most current version can be found on the Department website (www.michalaux.org). All Units should have a copy readily available at all Unit meetings for reference should the need arise. Please take some time at a Unit meeting to review the contents of these documents. These fundamental rules of our organization state how our membership agrees to govern itself and guarantee we are not in conflict with the requirements of the Department or National organizations.

Your Unit Standing Rules delineate the processes by which your Unit will be administered. When and where will your Unit meetings be held? When and how elections will be held? What are your annual dues, and do you have a separate initiation fee? Detailed information about your financial structure- these are a few items to include.

These documents supply continuity to Unit operations. They help organize Unit activities and provide a resource when questions arise and clarification is needed. They allow every member to know what is expected and keep them on the same page.

Because of the importance of these documents, they need to be reviewed regularly and updated as necessary. Keeping your governing documents up to date and making them available to all members is vital to a healthy organization that functions as a team to support our veterans, military, and their families. If there are no changes, send the "No Change" to the Chairperson for the file. The form can be found on the website in the Constitution and Bylaws Guide. When your Unit does vote to revise its Standing Rules, before they can take effect, please send three copies, correctly signed, to the Department Constitution and Bylaws Chairperson for review and approval.

Ann Arbor VA Healthcare System

Due to the COVID-19 situation(s), a 'typical' annual report with detailed figures could not be compiled as in previous years. On-site Volunteering was discontinued in mid-March of 2020. In January of 2023, restrictive levels of volunteer involvement had been permitted, and starting in June, Volunteers are allowed within the medical center, but actual volunteer involvement is still low. Although on-site Volunteer involvements have been limited, there is much to report from the Lieutenant Colonel Charles S. Kettles VA Medical Center.

Since 1953, the VA Ann Arbor Healthcare System has provided state-of-the-art healthcare services to the men and women who have proudly served our nation. The Department of Veterans Affairs designated the Ann Arbor Medical Center as a 1A facility, the highest level of complexity of care. Neurosurgery, coronary artery bypass, and laparoscopic surgeries are examples of the sophisticated level of care provided at the VA Ann Arbor Medical Center. The facility includes state-of-the-art ambulatory care clinics, operating rooms, a cardiac catheterization suite, intensive care units, laboratory, and diagnostic services.

The Ann Arbor System, with the main hospital campus located in Ann Arbor and with clinics in Canton, Jackson, Flint, Lansing, and Toledo, has serviced over 78,300 Veterans living in a 15-county area of Michigan and Ohio during the past fiscal year. The main hospital in Ann Arbor is a referral center for specialty care and operates 114 acute care beds and 40 Community Living Center beds. Over 681,350 outpatient visits were made, and more than 5,234 inpatients were provided in the hospital and extended care center.

The American Legion Auxiliary is one of 39 service organizations that volunteer at and support the Veteran needs in the Ann Arbor System. We are privileged to serve Veteran healthcare needs in any way we can. Due to COVID-19, many of the Auxiliary Member involvement/activities have been greatly reduced. Although on-site visits were/are restricted, Michigan Auxiliary Units continue to provide monetary and in-kind donations.

VAAHS is active in several programs. Some are presented here: the campaign to end Veteran Homelessness; Veteran Justice Outreach, Telehealth Clinics; My HealthyVet web-access services and information for veterans; Click 2 Benefits; #BeThere, a program to help prevent Veteran suicide; and No Veteran Dies Alone. This past December, the Center hosted its tenth annual Baby Shower event via drive-through.

Auxiliary members from the 2nd and 18th Districts continue participating in the Annual Gift Shop. Overall, Auxiliary Units were generous with cash and in-kind donations totaling \$6,688; special need donations such as flat-screen TVs, Microwaves, and iPads for patients to communicate with families/friends. Finally, our annual Father's Day program was canceled.

Since opening in 2020, The Fisher House has hosted over 3,900 veteran families, with the average stay being 4 and the longest of 53 days. The Fisher House is a beautiful home away from home that provides high-quality, temporary lodging to families and caregivers of Veterans and Servicemembers undergoing care at the VA facilities. I was proud to attend the Fisher House's Dedication Ceremony on September 23 and be one of the Volunteers who assisted in the tours/walk-throughs at the first Open House on June 27 for the VA Medical Center staff members.

The goal will be to provide the best care and support for our country's veterans and to support the VAAHS programs. As I complete my tenth year as the Department of Michigan American Legion Auxiliary appointed representative, one of my goals continues to be gathering donations to support the needs of the Fisher House in Ann Arbor and to have a successful Gift Shop. 2023 is tentatively planned for November 28 - 29th at the AA VA--overjoyed to be 'back' on-site.

Another goal for this year will be to increase the number of ALA volunteers (both in Ann Arbor and Toledo) and to increase volunteer opportunities within the VA /clinics. I suspect the volunteer involvement will challenge recruiting new and returning volunteers in the coming year; I welcome that challenge.

In closing, I am honored—and humbled—to have the opportunity to work with such dedicated staff, volunteers, and other supporters, including 'my Deputy' Ethel Putala. Thanks, Ethel, for all you do. Here at the Ann Arbor VA Health System, we service and support our Veterans.

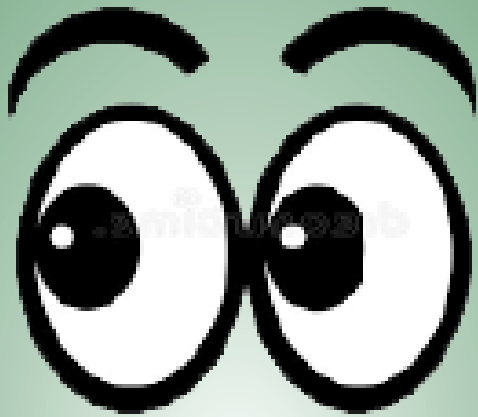

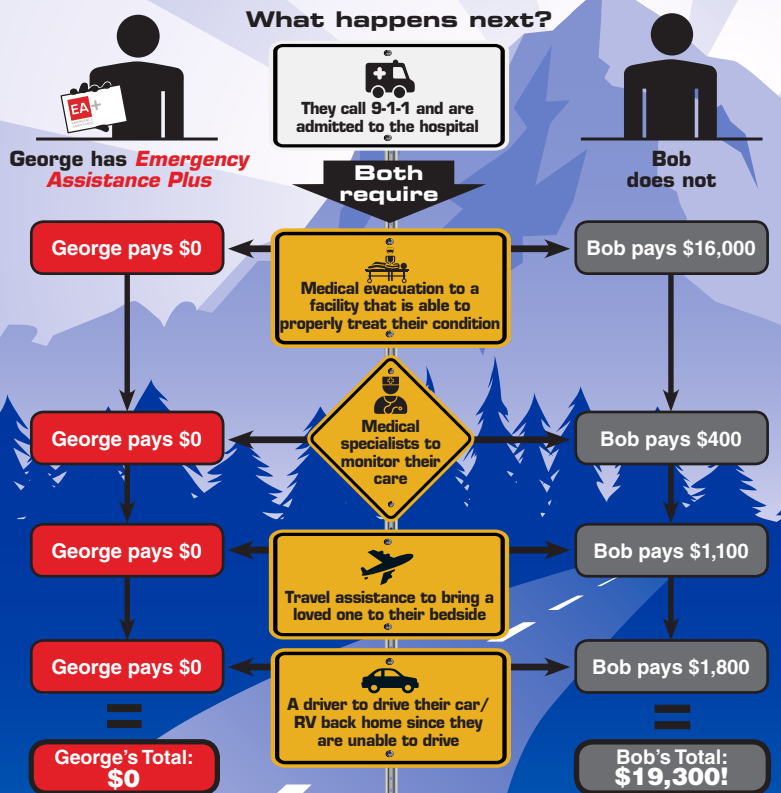
NEW MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL INCENTIVE

- 5) Triple Nickel Award for achieving all three membership goals of 105% Membership, Chartering five new Squadrons and 85% membership renewal.

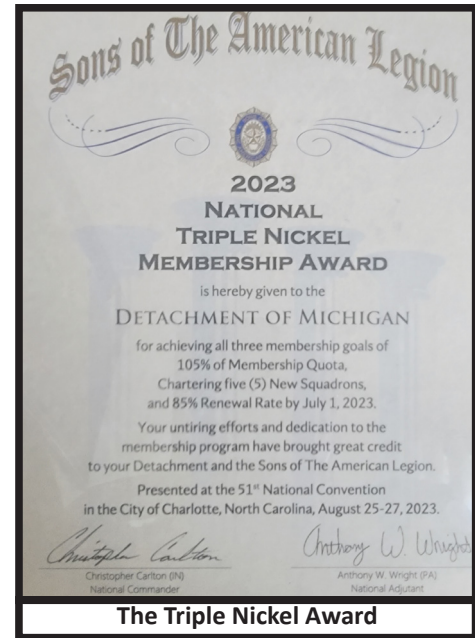

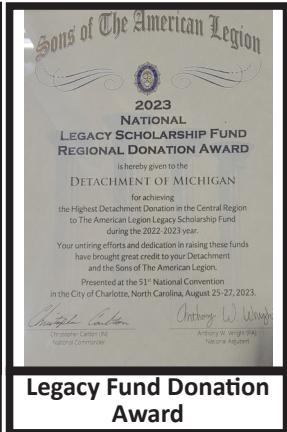

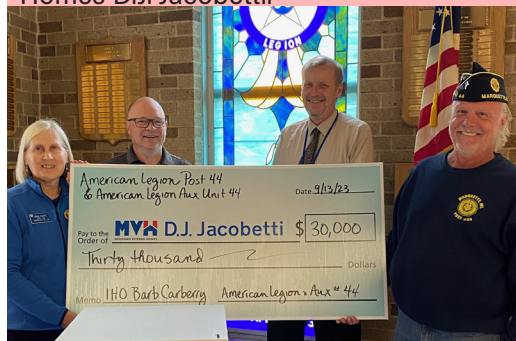
Around the State...
