As long as the necessary membership application is filled out and the prospective member provides a copy of his/her DD-214 discharge papers (this applies to Legion membership, prospective S.A.L., and Auxiliary members need to supply a copy of discharge papers for the relative through whom their eligibility is established) and they pay the appropriate amount for dues, simply submit these materials to the Legion or S.A.L. Adjutant. In fact, many members of the Sons like to carry around blank copies of membership applications for each of the Legion Family organizations, just in case.



We secured free passage through the Red Sea, which the Soviet Navy was threatening. After 59 days at sea, we docked in the Philippine Islands. I transferred to the carrier USS Independence CV 62, and later, due to a non-combat, service-connected condition, I received an honorable discharge on April 18, 1975.

I've been active in three local churches since 1983 and attend Michigan Center Bible Church. I lead a Community Group in our church and, over the years, have performed funeral services, made hospital visits and performed other church-related activities as a layperson.

I joined the American Legion 16 years ago. In April of 2011, I accepted the position of Chaplain of the Rose City Post in Jackson. In 2016, I accepted the position of 2nd District Chaplain. I am interested in serving my fellow veterans in assisted living facilities or facing end-of-life.






Michigan American Legion Baseball 2023





Six teams participated in the tournament, which was hosted by Gladstone Post 171. Teams were as follows: Escanaba Post 82, Gaylord Post 458, Gladstone Post 71, Clinton Twp. Post 176, Marquette Post 44 Blues, Trenton Post 426 Steel.

Trenton Post 426 came away with the ultimate title of Class A State Champions for the 2023 season, their second consecutive championship. The Hal Newhouser Award (MVP Award) went to Brock Beaudre of Trenton Post 426. Class AA State Tournament Highlights: 6 teams participated in the tournament, which Blissfield graciously hosted on short notice. Department is grateful to the Blissfield Post and everyone who assisted in hosting the tournament this past July. The teams included Adrian Post 275, Stevensville Post 568, Midland Post 165, Linwood Post 239, Blissfield Post 325, and Mt. Pleasant Post

Midland Post 165 came away with the ultimate Class AA State Champions title, and American Legion Post 239 came in second place. With Midland hosting the Great Lakes Regional Tournament for a second year, American Legion Post 239

also represented Michigan in the Regional Tournament.

For the individual awards, the Kiki Cuyler Award (MVP Award) went to Tanner Sonntag of Midland Post 165. Jack Wyatt Bakus of Midland received The 2023 Robert Turner Baseball Scholarship of \$500.00. The 2023 Department American Legion Diamond Scholarship was awarded to Caden Oliver of Adrian Post 275. Caden was awarded \$500 from The Michigan Department and an additional \$2,500 scholarship National. He is also placed on the All-American Diamond Academic Scholarship Team.

On August 2nd, the American Legion Great Lakes Regional tournament kicked off at Northwood University's Gerace Field. Our host again this year was Midland Berryhill Post 165, which has hosted the Great Lakes Regional Tournament a total of six times. As the host team, Berryhill received an automatic bid into the regional tournament, and Linwood Post 239 also represented Michigan. The other six teams competing in the tournament were Illinois state champion Danville Post 210 and runner-up Barrington

Post 158, Indiana state champion Lafayette Post 11, Iowa state champion Swisher Post 671, Wisconsin state champion Eau Claire Post 53 and runner-up Janesville Post 205.

The chance to be one of the top 64 teams out of approximately 4,000 teams nationwide naturally brings in a large crowd. According to Nelson Cronkright, Midland Berryhill Post 165 Baseball Chairman, the host team's goal is to ensure everyone involved has a good time. It all came together for a great start to the Great Lakes Regional Tournament, Rain storms periodically came through, delaying games throughout the tournament, but Post 165 handled everything flawlessly. In the end, neither Michigan team could not make it to the World Series. Linwood Post 239 was eliminated from the regionals by Eau Claire, WI. Midland Post 165 held out almost to the end of the regionals. Still, it fell short by one game when they were defeated by Cedar Rapids, IA, who won the Great Lakes Regional Championship and moved on to the American Legion World Series.



Fighting PTSD 1 Mile at a Time

Being a veteran diagnosed with chronic PTSD, I understand the struggle that others with PTSD deal with daily. What started as an idea of mine has already shown to be an event that has exceeded all my expectations. Right from the start, the support has been overwhelming. The route came together while thinking about living with PTSD, the Hell it can take you to, and only wanting to be in Paradise! Living in MI, we are fortunate enough to have a Hell, Michigan and a Paradise, Michigan, so what better towns to start and finish in than these two?

After thinking about it for quite a while, I spoke to Debbie Abraham, whom I knew from dealing with the paperwork for joining ALR. From there, I learned she was "Hugs," the Auxiliary Unit President Livonia Post 32, Assistant Director ALR Chapter 32, and First District of MI Auxiliary ALR Liaison. Without hesitation, she stepped right up to help with my dream.

We now needed to assemble a team. The first new member was Angela "Scrat" Snyder, the ALR Secretary, Auxiliary Vice President of District 3, ALR Liaison Leighr Wright Post #53 of Hillsdale, MI. The next was John "Longhair" Smith Post # 248. SAL Commander, ALR Road Captain. After that, we added Candy "Hawk's Cupcake" Willis, soon to be "Igo"!!! She and Jan Bailey will be working together on our sponsors. I can't wait to see what these two accomplish for our veterans together!

Now, on our way to making this a reality, Debbie, Angela, Jon, Candy and I are setting up, figuring things out, and adding people who can help in many different directions. What we hope will become an event to remember and continue for years till, hopefully, one day, all our Veterans with PTSD can quickly get the help needed to get their lives back to where they are not struggling with PTSD anymore.

After our team was fully formed, our first contact was with Ron Monroe of Mission 6 Service Dogs. After speaking with him about this and hearing what this organization does, I knew it was one I wanted to pick to help. The following organization I contacted was Zero Duck 30/Bikes and Battle Buddies. I spoke with Anthony Jurich (Tony) after a very informative conversation. His passion deeply moved me for those who have PTSD and his willingness to help. We knew we wanted this to be our second organization to support. After discussing with my committee, we agreed on these two, so the funds collected could help them.

We then decided to add one more, Willwin Lodge. We will collect non-perishable items that could be used for the Veterans staying at the lodge or keeping it clean and safe.

We soon created a Facebook page to help spread the word. Soon after it was up and running, it grew so fast. It caught the attention of Shell Maitland, a Biker advocate of MI with Christensen Law, who contacted me with the offer to be not only our legal "backbone" of the group but to help with any law situations as well as help from her entire team such as coming up with the flyer layout, setting up pre-registration and registration at the site. Shell has over 11 years of Advocating for the biker community in MI. We were so excited to add her and her team to ours!

With the full backing from James "Big Daddy" Austin, Chairman of the ALR committee, we were heading to putting our plans into action. I was contacted by Jan Bailey (the one work-



ing with my Cupcake), who is not only an RN/EMT who offered her medical expertise during the whole ride but also will be driving a chase vehicle with the ability, if need be to haul anyone's bike if need be. Jan has helped the I-500 snowmobile race in Sault Sainte Marie turn into the amazing race everyone looks forward to each year.

So, as of now, this will be a two-day ride open to any riders, vehicle, chase drivers and anyone willing to help along the way to support this event. We can still use all the help we can get before, during, and after the ride. The cost is \$35.00 per rider and \$20.00 per passenger. We will be having fundraisers throughout to raise enough money to help Veterans with PTSD greatly, hopefully! Pre-registration will begin in August 2023, with registration through Thursday, July 25th, 2024 and onsite on the morning of the ride, the 26th. We really would appreciate as many that can do pre-registration as early as possible so we can set the right places and accommodations for stops places to spread our word and stay. If you are a camping person, there will be places set up in our beginning and final location.

We made this a two-day ride to make it as easy as possible for any stage riders and to raise awareness of PTSD and Veterans along the way. We'll have a photographer with us from before the ride till the end. to schedule a time to come out as a troop at any time for scouting trips.




