Hours to go before a federal government shutdown was averted Sept. 30 when Congress approved a 45-day stopgap budget measure that would continue operations for the time being. If the shutdown had occurred, all U.S. military branches, many VA functions and other federal services would have been halted, including pay for military personnel. American Legion National Commander Daniel Seehafer called on Congress to find a solution in late September and reiterated the need for passage of the Pay Our Troops Act, which would protect members of the Armed Forces in the event of government shutdown.



Number of U.S. World War II military personnel who remained unaccounted for in September 2023, according to the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, as American Legion posts and members conducted remembrance ceremonies across the country. Another 7,486 from the Korean War were unaccounted for. Vietnam War: 1,578. Cold War: 126. Iraq and other countries: 6.
