Letter from the President

Dear Alumni,

Over the past 2 years, our alumni board has been very busy organizing an epic banquet. The board has allied with the Billerica Community Hall of Fame and Principal Tom Murphy to organize the first annual BCHF award presentation and the Banquet, with it all being held at the new BMHS building. How exciting!

The board went before the school committee several times, first to introduce ourselves and then to request use of the school and permission from the board to apply for a one-day license. We were given permission for use of the school, and we took off running getting things organized. We hired a new caterer, Amy, hired our wonderful DJ, Kathy Conway, and our photographer Sarah Strunk. The BCHF started accepting nominations, (I have included a deeper explanation of the BCHF in this booklet) our invitations were sent out.

Meanwhile we had not gotten the blessing of the School board on our one-day liquor license. Please note: the alumni board went to the school board (and principal) first, we asked #1 for permission to use the school for our banquet and #2 permission for moving forward on a one-day liquor license. We told them either way we would move forward with the banquet, if they said no to all, yes to all, or yes to the holding it at the school an no to the liquor license, and yes it was very contentious in our town by a very small group of people who wanted a no alcohol policy for all schools.

By a 3-2 vote we were given permission to apply for a one-day liquor license. Please note, there were very strict restrictions put on us, and we had a very reputable company who would provide the bar and wait staff of their own. The restrictions were a two-hour window of beer and wine only. (there was much more but I simplified it). This was all fine with us and the company we hired. Once the application was filled out, we had to get the application signed by all the departments. The application was submitted to be put on the agenda for the next available Selectmen meeting. And then COVID-19 happened. We at first postponed and then had to cancel everything.

This is the short letter put out to our members:

Due to the concerns of the coronavirus and large gatherings are not yet allowed in Massachusetts, the Alumni Board has decided to cancel this year's banquet. Along with our canceling of the banquet, the town of Billerica Community Hall of Fame has canceled this year's inductions, and will continue to accept

We will still be giving out 27 scholarship awards, along with the Jack Fay Athletic Achievement award!

We encourage all our alumni to please support us by paying your dues.

There will still be a booklet for this year. It will be put up on our website (bmhsalumni.org), Facebook and mailed if desired.

This is unprecedented times we are in, please be safe and follow precautions set.

On the 2019 banquet, everyone had a great time and we look forward to our banquet at the High School.

The Town of Billerica Community Hall of Fame



You can also mail in applications. Hopefully, the ceremony will happen in 2021.






The Howe High Scholarship in memory of Lawrence (Larry) and Carol Hughes DeBenedictis:

The student selected for this Award is an athlete, a community volunteer and an excellent student. Selected for this award is: Isabella Tossone




The Karyn (Hansis) Marmiani Annual Scholarship,





The Doug Dooley Scholarship.





Thank you to all the students of the class of 2020. I hope you remain graceful, patient, kind, curious, peaceful and push the boundaries of your knowledge.



This is vice principal Brooks who retired at the end of June 2020. We wish you a wonderful and fulfilling retirement.

In 2018 the Alumni Association introduced the *The Annual Jack Fay Athletic Achievement award*.

Jack Fay was a standout athlete at Howe High School, playing first string on the football, basketball and baseball teams in his sophomore, junior and senior years. He was selected to numerous all-star teams and, on several occasions, selected most valuable player. After graduating in 1953 he enlisted in the Air Force. During tours of duty in Japan and Europe he played on Air Force-wide basketball teams. In 1965, he arranged to be transferred to the US Army and immediately volunteered for duty in Vietnam. While assigned to an Airborne Unit, he was awarded the Bronze Star for conspicuous performance during combat operations. During his 22 years of military service, he managed to attain a Baccalaureate in history and a Master's degree in business administration. In 1974, he retired from the Army and went to work for the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council, then to the University of Louisville where he served as Director of the National Crime Prevention Institute, then to corporate-level management with British Petroleum. During the years he spent in the private sector, he authored ten-plus nonfiction books principally dealing in corporate security management. In 1999 he left BP to start up a business of his own. Called Learning Shop USA, the business provides adult education and training courses online.

Selection Criteria for the Jack Fay Athletic Achievement Award:

- Would be a senior; male or female
- Has been a player on any BMHS team in his/her senior year during all of that year
- Has demonstrated an above-average athletic skill
- Has demonstrated an attitude of fair play and sportsmanship
- The selection be made by a BMHS coach or coaches

In 2020, the Jack Fay Award will be granted to a male and female student-athlete from Billerica Memorial High School. The class of 2020 has an abundance of talent three sport athletes but 2 of them have made a tremendous impact to their teammates and coaches alike.

This year the 2020 Jack Fay Award is granted to

Garrett Murphy and Kayleen McCormack.

From the Athletic Director, Coach John Magliozzi:

Both student-athletes have been selected by their teammates as 3 sports captains of their respected teams and both students received the most nominations by the coaching staff at BMHS. This is a clear tribute to their character and impact they have had to their teams.

With that said, today is a day for Garrett to be recognized as a great teammate and athlete. Most importantly, Garrett has represented Billerica Memorial High School with the utmost integrity and sportsmanship that a school could expect. Garrett is a true scholar student athlete with a 3.6 GPA and long list of athletic accomplishments. He will attend UMASS-Lowell for his undergraduate degree and be a member of their Division I Lacrosse team.

Over the past 4 years, Garrett has participated in at least 150 varsity games in hockey, lacrosse, and golf which has earned him "The Master of Sports Award" at BMHS. He has also earned All-Conference Awards from the Merrimack Valley Conference in hockey, golf, and lacrosse. As a senior, Garrett has been awarded with the prestigious "Barbara Hood Scholar Athlete Award. I would like to add that he was also a captain of three teams.

Likewise, Kayleen McCormack was a three-sport captain of the soccer, basketball, and tennis teams. She has been described as a great teammate with a relentless work ethic! She takes great pride in all that she does. Kayleen has also been recognized as a Merrimack Valley All-Conference athlete in all 3 sports as well as earning the "Master of Sports Award at BMHS. Kayleen will continue her education and athletics at Fitchburg State University as a member of the girls' soccer team.

In today's athletic environment, it difficult to find a 3-sport student athlete that has had such a profound impact on all 3 of the teams. It's with great pleasure to see 2 students such as Garrett and Kayleen be awarded with the honor of the Jack Fay Award.



I am writing this in remembrance of Robert W. Solomon, BMHS Class of 1961, who passed from this life way too soon. I have very cherished memories of my four years at Billerica Memorial High School, and Bobby is right there in most of them and still giving me reminders to keep my eye on the ball.

In those days, and probably now I expect, you went to the one High School near Billerica Center, travelled to and from on foot or by bus or car from one of the well-known sections of the town - Pinehurst, Nuttings' Lake, North Billerica, or "The Center". My coming from "The Lake", and Bob from "The North", I had never set eyes on Robert Solomon until freshman year started in the fall of 1957, going out for the Freshman Football team. However, it didn't take long to feel like he had been a friend forever. Bobby was an all-around American boy. He played football on a team where the starting eleven spotted the opposition about 35 to 50 pounds per player, even when we were seniors. Nevertheless, he managed to spin through some infinitesimally small holes that we were just about able to pry open for him, and roll up scores. We actually had a winning season senior year. We also had some other great players such as Doug Dooley who could catch anything thrown within five yards of him, but to me Bobby Solomon put his soul into every minute he was on the gridiron. Bobby was that way with all his endeavors. Our friendship started in a casual way on the field and then built in the classrooms, cafeteria, back on the field, after school. I didn't realize we were that close until, of course, we would never be again.

I've called him Robert, Bobby, Bob. That's on purpose because he went by all three, and had a spark-plug personality. He was friendly and easy going to everyone unless you berated or bullied someone. By senior year, as I zeroed in on my long held dream, he was quick to push me to maintain grades, go to interviews, etc. to gain an appointment to the US Naval Academy. When it finally came through he was one of the two closest friends I had who drove me to South Station, where I boarded the night train, about four days after graduation, for Washington D.C. with transfer to a bus over to Annapolis Six days after graduation day I was in a formation in Annapolis Maryland, taking the oath along with some eight hundred other young men as a Midshipman in the U.S. Navy. I feel I might never have been in that formation if not for Bob. In a way that was very much a trademark with him he would talk up after school workouts, even if it were not our season, but to get me prepared for all the rigorous tests one had to go through to just qualify, so we were fixtures around the gym almost every day through senior year. He even went to Mr. Gracie, our PE teacher and asked him why he had given me a B in PTE and didn't he know I wanted to go to Navy. George Gracie told him he gave it to me because he thought I could push myself harder. So, Bob pushed me harder and I got back to an A grade.

All of the above might make you say what the heck, Bob was doing what any friend would do, but I knew he was adding the difference that only a true friend could. There was an incident at the end of my first leave and return to Billerica during Christmas 1961 break that speaks to the heart of that remarkable young man.

I had answered a call from two First Class (Senior) Midshipmen from Massachusetts to fill an extra seat they had in the car they were renting to drive home for Christmas leave and return. The price was right as I couldn't afford air fare, and they should know what they were doing after three previous Christmas seasons. I was, of course, very well aware that if I didn't get back to the Academy, and inside the walls of Bancroft Hall, before mid-night on the 3rd of January I would receive a Major Violation of Naval Academy conduct regulations. Not good for someone as new to the place as seven months, and Major Violations could, by definition, be reasons for dismissal.

The upperclassmen were to drop me at an agreed to spot on the Mass Pike where my Mother would pick me up and then I would meet them there for the return trip at an also agreed time on the day of return. We had till midnight that day to check in and there would be a Navy Commander waiting at the only open entrance to snag anyone not on time.

My Mother was going to drive me to the departure point on the designated day. The drive to Annapolis was a very makeable trip in the allotted time but only if you didn't dally. Bobby volunteered to come along and ride with us to the drop and keep her company back to Billerica. We arrived at the site early and as the old saying goes, things went awry. The upperclassmen never showed. We were absolutely at the right place and well before the stated time.

Well, as time was, as they say, awasting, I knew I had to be accounted for in Annapolis and before the door of Bancroft hall closed at midnight or my goose was cooked. We waited as long as prudent for them to show and Bob was the first to say, "let's get going and drive you back." It was a fairly demanding trip, especially when you have a tight deadline, and Bob and I took turns driving. The nugget of the story is, however, the way Bob was a friend who put me first and he was an absolute gentleman in making the entire hectic and rushed trip easy on my mother. She said she'd like to put up for the night before driving back in the dark, and he absolutely agreed. She paid for accommodations for them both and later told me of the trip back: "What a sharp, considerate young man Robert is." That's high praise from my mother. Bob was all of that though, and in every instance I know of, he put himself out and/or changed his own plans to accommodate others; that time with no prior knowledge and with no regard for losing basically two days for nothing that profited him.

Sadly, I never got to be with him much at all after that as our paths crossed infrequently but I had cause to think about him often. We were within about 150 miles of each other when he was an Army helicopter Crew Chief in Viet Nam and I was a Navy Swift Boat Skipper in country. I was, and still am of course, proud of him for his service to our country.

Bobby, I'm proud I knew Ya, and may God keep your memory alive for all who love you.

To Barbara: I thank you for allowing me to place this with the Reunion Committee. I hope you can glean even more reasons to admire and love him - as if you needed any.
