#### **DEFIBRILLATOR DEMONSTRATION.**

Following the club's purchase of two defibrillators, a special meeting was held so that we could invite a representative from St. John's Ambulance to give us instructions on using the devices. **CPR Training Officer, Dush Dedic** visited us on Wednesday 19th to explain the procedure.

Dush took us through an imaginary event, explaining in detail, how to go about helping someone who has suffered a cardiac arrest. Calling 000, quickly assessing the situation, checking for personal danger and signs of consciousness in the patient were covered clearly. The machine must **only** be used in the case of cardiac arrest, when the subject is not breathing and there is no pulse; it must not be used in the case of heart attack and Dush took care to explain the difference between the

two. In heart attack the patient is usually conscious, in which case the defibrillator is **not** used. The defibrillator gives clear, verbal instructions for its use. Each instruction is repeated in case it is not understood the first time.

The batteries for the unit have a life span of 4 years and are able to be used 200 times before replacing the battery pack. Treatment pads can only be used once before replacement.

In the photo at above Dush demonstrates the position for placing the treatment pads on the torso of a child which is front and back rather than both on the front as in an adult.

There was time for questions at the end of the demonstration. There is an excellent video explaining the use of a defibrillator at St. John's website, www.stjohnvic.com.au

The club's defibrillators can be found in the library section of the clubroom and near the finishing room in the workshop. There is also a leaflet of instructions and all accessories necessary in each defib box. box
