SHOW & TELL. Keith Towe has made the small turned box below, using walnut with the centre panel from walnut sap wood. The tiny box at far right is roughly the size of a walnut but is turned from a pipe

briar which was not suitable for making a pipe. The box is just large

enough to hold a couple of wedding rings.







Jan Veenstra showed us the table decoration he made from a piece of cedar. Jan used pyrography to embellish the wood and added a metal rose, that was made by his son, and some artificial flowers.

The two shallow dishes at right are by **Paul Ryan**. Made from red gum they

are finished with coconut oil and grape seed oil.

Chris Drysdale showed us his carvings, depicting a sword fish, a bull and a horse, made using his CNC machine. Chris used 30mm ply to achieve the two-toned effect.

The large cutting board, in the shape of an apple, is camphor laurel and is also by Chris



Following the club's recent gift (from Boukje Kleinekoort) to the Kimbe Assistance Project, I have received the following report in which the tools are acknowledged.

2018 - 2019 REPORT

At the end of the financial year, we think it is appropriate to report on the situation of The Kimbe Assistance Project Inc.

CURRENT PROJECTS

Finalising Container Number 7.

We are working to have this container leave Melbourne on the vessel going to PNG around 11 – 13 September. This means we need to have the container ready for movement at the end of August. (Close to finish - the door is just in front of the blue boxes) In the past few months we have collected some excellent school resources – particularly books, and technical school aids. Berwick



Woodworkers' Club have passed on to us a large consignment of power and hand tools from a deceased member. We also have acquired IT and audio visual equipment, as well as some medical aids such as wheelchairs, walkers and a Slit Lamp for the Fred Hollows Eye Clinic.

The tabernacle that was used in the school hall while our parish church was being renovated has also been donated to the Project.

Two donations, totalling \$1,500 were donated specifically for the purchase of solar lighting kits. We have ordered 12 kits for this container.

The Future

We could not refuse the donation of all the tools as we are trying to build up the resources of the Tech School at Poinini in West New Britain. Most of these tools will go towards the Vocational Training Wing which schools older students who do not have the qualification to go on to higher education (Years 9 to 12 equivalent in Australia). The vocational Courses prepare students to work in Technical Trades.

After finalizing this container, we now believe that we need to send one more to Kimbe (after the current one) to clear the donated goods that are at our home. It is hard to refuse good quality gifts that otherwise would go to landfill.

We think we are healthy enough to do one more container, so we have gained committee approval to carry on for one more time.
