A quirky feature of David's board is the blue luminous power mixed into the resin in which the pieces are set. When exposed to UV light for 2 hours, the resin area glows in the dark for roughly 20 minutes.

GOODBYE, BEST WISHES AND MANY THANKS.

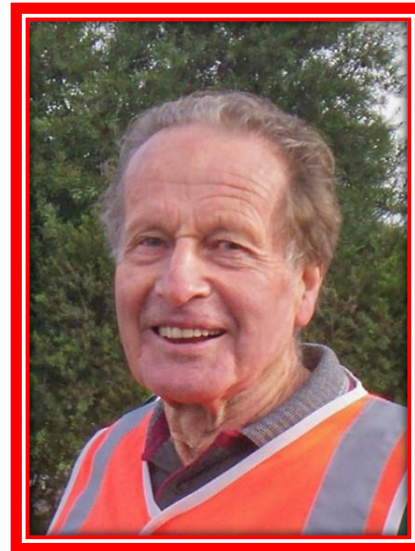
As most of our members are aware, long serving club member **Bert McGinty** has left us to go to live in Canberra, to be near his son Nigel and family.

VICTORIAN MEN'S SHED ASSOCIATION NEWS.

Although Berwick District Woodworkers Club Inc. is not a Men's Shed, the club belongs to the Association, hosting and attending Cluster Meetings whenever possible. Club member **Wayne Lucas** is our representative, keeping us informed of Men's Shed news and activities. Following are some snippets from the latest **VMSA Special Bulletin** in response to the Victorian State of Emergency. Although, so far, no Men's Sheds have been lost in the fires, we are reminded that " *Accessing the affected areas is not recommended. Note that we have also been advised the Victorian fire season peaks around early February and in some areas it may be later.*"

In the event that Men's Sheds may be lost, recommendations are:

Cash donations should only be passed to organisations that pass on 100% of the monies.
