
Not for Show & Tell: Len Preece is working on this model soft top car.

SAFETY NOTES - COMPOUND MITRE SAW

Know and follow the general safety rules for operating power tools. Make all adjustments while the machine is turned off.

Never reach across the path of the blade. When the machine is running, always keep your hands at least 6 inches (150 mm) from the blade.

Keep the safety guard in position at all times.

Wait until the blade is running full speed before starting a cut. Never stand in line with the blade. If you push the blade with your right hand, stand to the left. If you push the blade with your left hand, stand to the right.

Use one hand to push the saw through the stock. Use the other hand to hold the stock against the fence. Keep both hands away from the cutting line.

Cut only one piece of wood at a time.

Feed the blade slowly.



SNAPSHOT OF ALEXANDER DRYSDALE:

Don't try to change the world - just change yourself. - **Alexander Drysdale.** A travelling lay preacher with the Uniting Church, a qualified Master Mariner, a logistics and distribution specialist and a former adult education trainer.

Now 85 and an active member of the Berwick Woodworking Club, Alexander Drysdale shows no intention of slowing down.

When COVID restrictions hit Berwick, Alexander did a charity run from Cranbourne to Shepparton for 49 consecutive Sundays. He'd volunteered to deliver the regular bread donations from Baker's Delight, which could no longer, because of Covid, be distributed to the community from the local church hall, to a Shepparton farmer to feed their cows. "It gave him a legitimate reason to be out on the roads," he said.



Alexander was born in Glasgow in 1936, as one of three children. One day his father, a strict Scottish Presbyterian asked, "What do you want to do?" Alexander told him that he either wanted to go into the Forestry Commission as a ranger or go to sea.

In 1951, his father enrolled 15-year old Alexander into HMS Conway, a full-board pre-sea training school. Two years later at the tender age of 17, he went to sea as a cadet with Canadian Pacific Steamships Ltd, and remained at sea for the next 11 years.

In hindsight it may not have been the best career because he suffered from sea sickness for the first three years until he was mysteriously cured by an anonymous passenger when she gave him "a severe talking to."

A few years later aged 23, he crossed the equator for the first time and in the tradition of the sea, he and a few other hapless souls were ceremoniously painted (by King Neptune) with a mixture of cocoa, salt and water, and then thrown into the ship's swimming pool to wash.

When he left the sea Alexander continued to work on the docks as a bulk oil surveyor, responsible for the quantity and quality analysis of oil and chemical cargos from other ships after they docked.

During the next 25 years of his career, he worked for several companies in depot management, warehouse supervision, and distribution management & logistics, before taking the giant leap from employee to self-employment, specialising in logistics and communications.

At age 53, in October 1989, he migrated to Australia. "It seemed like a good idea at the time," he explains.

Here, he relocated into the public service where he spent the next 13 years in training and employment services until his retirement age 67.

Before that though, Alexander met and married the love of his life, Jillian, a divorcee with three children. They are due to celebrate their 24th anniversary this year.

He and Jillian are both members of the Uniting Church. As a lay preacher for that church Alexander has delivered almost 270 services across Victoria.
