But they'll sense it. And it'll be your Golden Ticket to their hearts.

After I finished one of my latest books, I asked the author, "Why did you pick my audition?" He said, "Well, we had about 5 finalist we were listening to and I asked my wife which one she liked. She said, 'Well, I like them all, but I think Larry would be pleasing to listen too over a whole long book."

Now, I can't explain why she felt that way, but I like to think that my interpretation of her husband's words made her feel comfortable, that she liked the interspersed humor, felt engaged with the material and sensed the authenticity in the writer's words. In other words, my narration didn't get in the way of the author's information and personality, but rather, allowed it to come through. That's what I like to think, anyway.

### If charm is present in an authentic way, it'll come through the read.

I'm gonna have to give James Hammock Nobles the credit for that. (And, yes, Hammock is a weird name!!!)

But it really boils down to THE Golden Ticket (Rule): "In everything, do to others what you would have them do to you" (Matt 7:12).

Be kind. Be curious. Be humorous. Be charming! (Thanks Dad)

more delicious. I really liked your appropriately placed muted chuckles too.


