Sunday, March 31st, is a day of great celebration, joy and new beginnings! Easter is a day when we can live as if all that has happened before has been made fresh and new. Theologian Annie Dillard in her words above, remind us that although Easter brings joy and wonder, the events leading up to it and the actual empty tomb can also bring fear of the unknown. This past year has certainly presented us with many moments of fear and doubt. Yet our faith and belief in Christ's Resurrection provide hope that such uncertainty is nearing an end!

Facebook Live Streaming Changes

Due to copyright restrictions, our worship service live streaming will be slightly different and effective immediately. The Live Stream will begin at approximately 10:10 and go until the end of the message. Certain portions that will not be live streamed will be available via links on the Grace Facebook page immediately preceding and following the live streamed worship service. At 10am, the first contemporary song will be posted to the Grace Facebook page. (The in-person worship will hear the announcements, prelude, and the contemporary song.) Live streaming will begin with the call to worship. The rest of the service will be live streamed until the end of the message. The video associated with the message and the final contemporary song will be posted on the Grace Facebook page at approximately 10:50. (The in-person worship will then watch that video, sing with the contemporary song, and sing the Choral Benediction). Please be sure to turn on Live Stream notifications for Grace's Facebook page. The Sunday bulletin can be found on the Grace website under the "Weekly Mailers" tab. Within the weekly mailer, you will find the bulletin and the announcements that were read at the beginning of the worship service. While we miss worshiping with you in person, hopefully these changes will help you to still feel connected to the worship service. 

March Consistory Digest

There were 13 members present including Pastor Young, Amy Fawks, Carroll Miller, and Patti Miller.

Treasurer's report:

General pledge February 2024: \$7,058 General pledge February 2023: \$6,496

The Consistory voted to hire Karen Samuelson as Grace office secretary effective April 8. 2024. She will work 20 hours per week.

The By-laws Committee met March 10. The Committee looked at Articles I through III. The next meeting will be April 22, 2024.

Dave Fawks reported estimates were received from Trump Floor Coverings to repair the floor in Fellowship Hall. Quotes from other flooring companies may be requested. He also reported the sinks in the kitchen have been fixed.

The Consistory approved the purchase of a 22" cut Toro mower, gas string trimmer, string, leaf blower, 2-gallon gas can, and gloves. The purchase will be made from Lowe's for approximately \$900.00.

Amy Fawks reported for Worship & Music Committee:

- Plans for Easter with worship opportunities at both Grace and Trinity, Gettysburg.
- Communion will now have only gluten-free bread for all to be more inclusive of others.
- There will be a choir on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Amy Fawks suggested Grace should have a photo release form for all photos of events posted on the internet. The Consistory agreed with the need for a photo release form.

Vickie Arnold reported for the Transitional Ministry Team:

- There will be a luncheon after the Palm Sunday worship service. It will be held in the Gathering Place, with potential overflow going to the nursery. There are signup sheets on the Gathering Place bulletin board.
- The first Town Hall is scheduled for Sunday April 14th to be held in the Gathering Place and in the sanctuary. More information will be forthcoming as our second meeting is set for Wednesday March 13th.

Pastor Fred gave an update on the Transitional Ministry Team:

The first gathering of the Transition Team was quite successful. They identified a few areas for the first Town Hall Session:

- **Revisiting our Covenant** conversations on rebuilding our connections, relationships and trust. (April 14, 2024 at 10 AM)
- Worship
- What will excite you for Grace?
- Church facility

The team talked about the best format for the Town Hall sessions and decided to focus these gatherings on worship. We will begin with worship...head into our discussion...end with worship. The first Town Hall will be in the sanctuary.

Team members will split the current church directory and send invitations to each household to invite everyone's participation.

Patti Miller reported:

During February she made 22 visits to senior care facilities and homes and two hospital visits. There are currently 23 total members who for various reasons are unable to attend worship physically. She made over 20 phone calls to stay in touch with shut-ins and to arrange visits. She records the prayer list and the Bible moment every evening around 10 PM on our special phone line, and often receives messages from those who listen, both on the line and through calls on her phone. That phone line will become the venue to announce any necessary closing of the church due to inclement weather.

The Outreach Committee reported:

- The February card signing was well received. There were 41 cards signed.
- A car show in the Grace parking lot has been planned for Saturday May 4, 10 AM to 2 PM, with May 11 as the rain date. The Home Dog, LLC food stand will be available May 4. Grace volunteers will sell hot dogs on the rain date. We are asking for the following donations: socks for the HACC Changing Lives Shelter, and cash donations to be split evenly between New Hope Ministries and the YWCA Women's Shelter. Advertising is underway.

The UCC's One Great Hour of Sharing will once again be collected at Grace. The collection will be taken during the month of April. This offering is for people in need. A 4-minure video will be shown during the announcements on April 7. Offering envelopes will be available beginning Sunday April 7.

It was decided to have folders available in the church office for public review pertaining to Consistory minutes, congregation meeting minutes, and committee meeting minutes.

As part of Grace's time of transition, a Pastoral Relations Committee will be established as a liaison between the congregation and the pastor. This committee is to help ensure proper communication and open dialogue and will be a permanent part of our committee structure. Below is an explanation of the purpose of such a team.

The Pastoral Relations Committee

The purpose of a Pastoral Relations Committee, or PRC (sometimes called PPRC, for Pastor-Parish Relations Committee) is to support the healthy relationship between pastor and congregants in order to promote healthy, faithful, shared ministry. It does this in two primary ways: by serving as an advisory group to the minister, sharing ideas, dreams, expectations, and concerns of the congregation with the pastor; and by serving as a support group for the pastor's leadership, interpreting roles, functions, boundaries, opportunities, and needs of the pastor to the congregation. PRCs are places to help the minister and the congregation maintain appropriate expectations for the scope of the minister's work, and for the pastor to be able to test visions and receive support for their continued growth in ministry.

When these committees work well, they promote honest communication, provide robust support and advocacy for the pastor, create confidential spaces for clear communication, and provide opportunities for the minister and the committee to reflect on their ministry. They are composed of spiritually mature, thoughtful people who have the respect of both the congregation and the pastor, and who model discernment, prayerfulness, integrity, and trustworthiness. These individuals are vitally interested in the life and mission of the congregation, are able to maintain confidences, and can appreciate differing points of view and to reconcile differences.

When these committees do not work well, they promote triangulation and anonymous complaints, circumvent church decision-making processes, and create an adversarial group opposed to the pastor's leadership. These committees are composed of individuals with a particular ax to grind (either in the life of the church or against the minister), who are prone to gossip and anonymous complaints, who either avoid conflict or create it for destructive purposes, and who have difficulty maintaining appropriate confidences.

Committees on Ministry have a role in encouraging congregations to develop healthy and robust Pastoral Relations Committees, encouraging ministers to work in partnership with these groups, and in working with congregations who need training or equipping for such committees.
