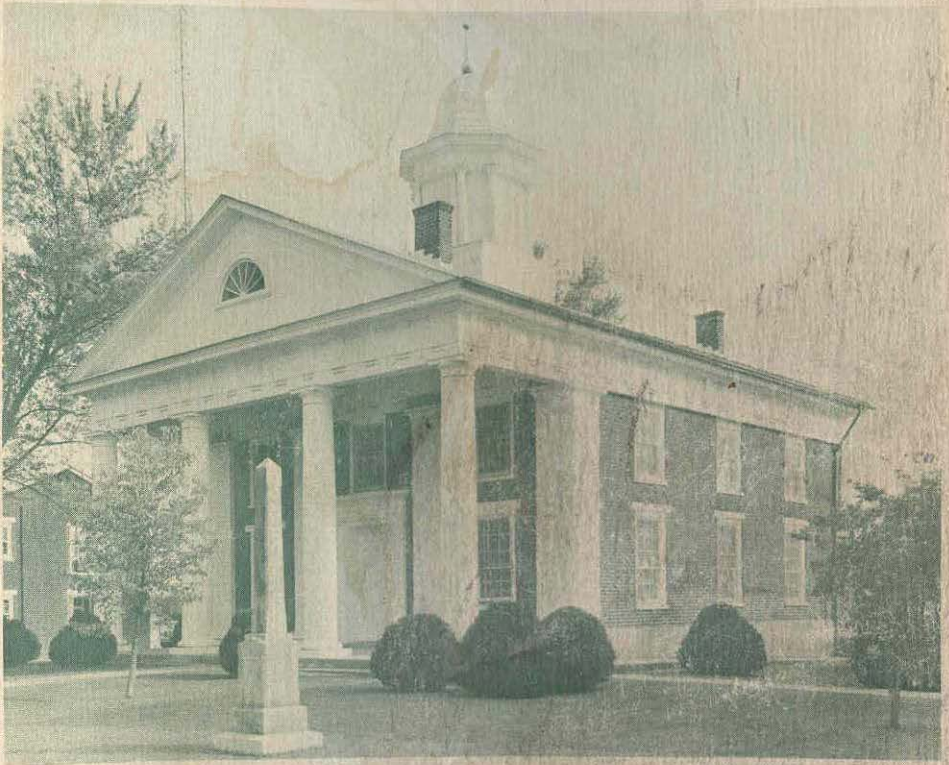

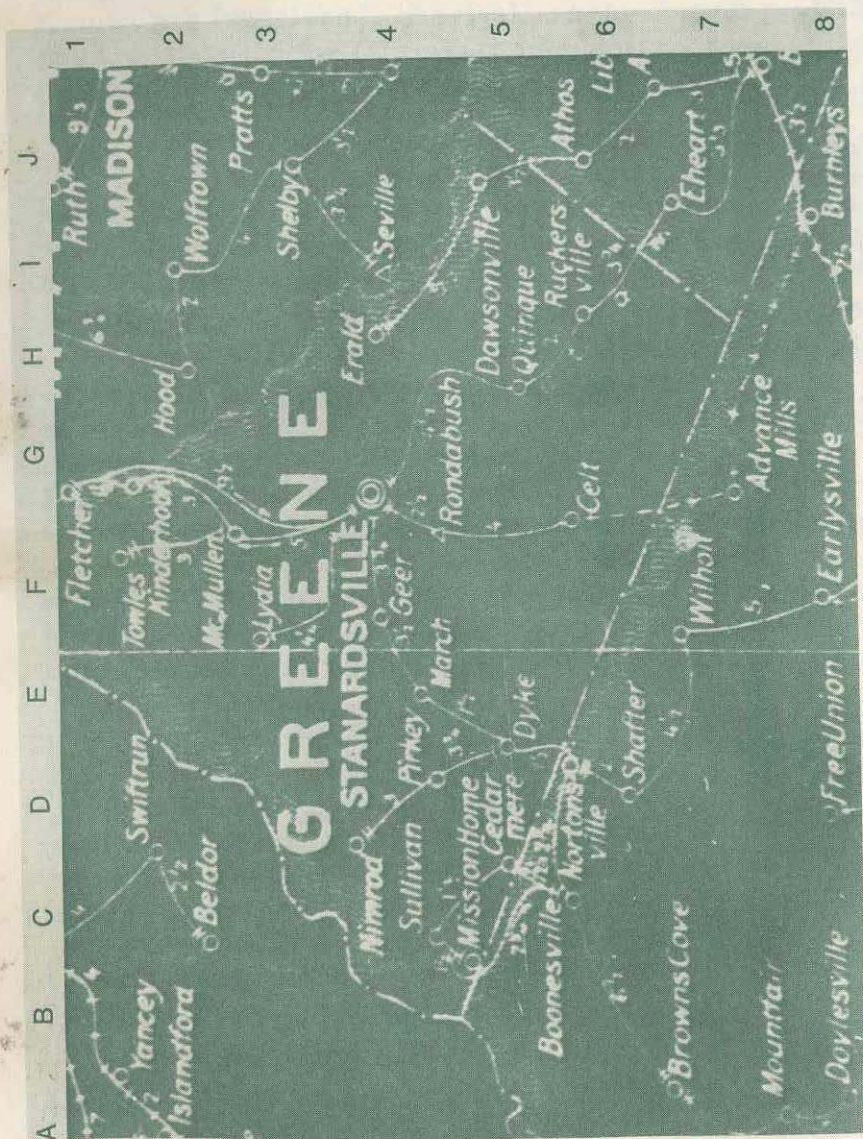

GREENE COUNTY POSTMASTERS, 1832-1964*

By Nancy H. Morris

The majority of early records of postal service of Greene County have been microfilmed from the original documents by the National Archives. It is from this microfilm that I have transcribed the following list [and miscellaneous notes] of appointments of postmasters in Greene County which I shall endeavor to interpret in this article. The records were compiled by the Archives and I have arranged them in alphabetical order by post office. The records of the appointments of postmasters were then arranged in chronological order. Some of the miscellaneous notes were originally researched by Roger Bristol, University of Virginia, Alderman Library, for a Virginia Placename Society publication; Bristol's name follows his notes.

An asterisk indicates a public or private school was adjacent to the post office building. During the period 1832-1964 two private schools were located in Greene County; 1] Blue Ridge Industrial School [BRIS and later St. George] which had a post office on the campus and 2] The Church of the Brethren Industrial School [CBIS] which did not have a post office on the campus. All other schools were public schools. All the schools were researched by Bristol.

Locations described are present day locations, using the Virginia State Highway system numbers. Brackets are used to indicate additions by author for clarity.

Greene County had, at different times in its history, as many as 42 post offices. Established from Orange County in 1838, Greene County now has had its number of post offices reduced to five: 1] Stanardsville, the county seat, 2] Mission Home, 3] Dyke, 4] Quinque and, 5] Ruckersville. From the start, all the post offices in Greene County were fourth class post offices. Today, of the remaining five post offices, Stanardsville is a third

class post office but the other four remain as fourth class. First, second, and third class postmasters are appointed by the President with the approval of the Senate but appointments of fourth class post offices are made by the Postmaster General.
