ABOUT YACM ORGANIZATION

The Young Adults in Christian Ministries was accepted as the third division of the Christian Education Department at the 1986 Convention on Christian Education (Livingstone College, Salisbury, North Carolina). In 1990, history records YACM as officially organized at the Convention on Christian Education at Livingstone College, Salisbury, North Carolina.

FUNCTIONS

The Young Adults in Christian Ministries shall:

- Serve as a policy making body for the young adults of the AME Zion Church
- Cultivate Young Adult membership in the AME Zion Church
- Promote ecumenical involvement on all levels
- Make recommendations in those areas which are Young Adult concerns to the Connectional

STEERING COMMITTEE

- Aid Local, District, Conference and Episcopal units of the Young Adults in Christian Ministries and other Young Adult organizations
- Develop workshops and/or seminars that promote the sharing of information on the problems and concerns that face young adults in today's society
- Provide for the development of leadership skills and abilities among the Young Adults of the denomination. Also, to challenge their involvement in the total ministry of the church.

PURPOSE

To encourage and motivate young adults to maintain committed lives to Christ and practice Christian principles. CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE


REV. RICK LEE, CHAIRPERSON

While the U.S Homeownership rate increased to 65.5% in 2021 and Asian and Hispanic Americans experienced the largest homeownership rate gains over the last decade and Asian Americans reached an all time high 62.8%. The rate amongst African Americans lags significantly 44% and has only increased 0.4% in the last decade; which is 29 percentage points less than White Americans 72.7% . We endeavor to educate young adults on how to close that gap and not only achieve their American dream but to also build wealth for generations to come!

A few tips to help you on your Homeownership journey;

1.Get your financial house in order;

- Gather pay stubs/ proof of employment
- Tax documents/ bank statements
- Asset & Debt information
- Get pre- approved
- Know your credit score
- Determine how much you will use as a down payment

2. Work with a reliable Realtor and Lender

- When looking for a realtor/lender get referrals from family, friends and colleagues, also search for any reviews
- Research mortgages available to first time buyers
- Research first time buyers down payment assistance in your area

3. Tour homes

- Tour as many homes as possible both online and in person
- Research the neighborhoods / school districts
- Be sure to visit the neighborhood at different times to make sure it's right for you

4. Make an offer but inspect the property

- Make sure your offer is contingent upon an inspection
- Schedule an inspection to identify major property issues like foundation, roof, HVAC, plumbing and even electrical
- Any issues found during inspection can help you to determine if you want to move forward at all or negotiate a better price

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Our goal throughout the month is to increase awareness of the disease and stress the importance of mammograms as the best tool to screen for breast cancer, the second most common type of cancer among women. Knowing how your breasts normally look and feel is an important part of your breast health. Although having regular screening tests for breast cancer is important, mammograms do not find every breast cancer. This means it's also important for you to know what your breasts normally look and feel like, so you'll be aware of any changes in your breasts.

The most common symptom of breast cancer is a new lump or mass (although most breast lumps are not cancer). A painless, hard mass that has irregular edges is more likely to be cancer, but breast cancers can be also soft, round, tender, or even painful. Other possible symptoms of breast cancer include:

- Swelling of all or part of a breast(even if no lump is felt)
- Skin dimpling
- Breast or nipple pain
- Nipple retraction(turning inward)
- Nipple or breast skin that is red, dry, flaking ,or thickened
- Nipple discharge(other than breast milk)

• Swollen lymph nodes under the arm or near the collarbone(Sometimes this can be a sign of breast cancer spread even before the original tumor in the breast is large enough to be felt.)

Providing helpful tips and strategies are given to women and men for early detection, lowering risk factors, and highlighting survivor stories.

October is also Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and we will also use this month to bring awareness as well as advocate for the end of domestic violence. We want to be able to provide YA with the necessary tools and support to combat domestic abuse. To educate yourself further on the signs and/ or how to help. You can check out the
